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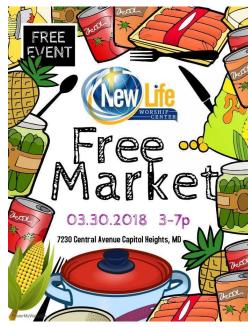






















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Pastor's Report

Now unto Him who is able to do exceedingly abundantly above all we can ask or think according to the power that worketh in us (Ephesians 3:20). With God's help, we accomplished the following this year:

Daycare Success: With special thanks to Angela Riley and her staff, our center received its license for the first time in history. This license allowed us to operate our before and after care program and opened the door for us to prepare our infants and toddlers rooms. Additionally, the daycare finished the year in the black by \$35,000! As a church we finished the year \$51,000 in the black. Praise God!

Missions (Local and Global), Outreach, and Benevolence: Because of the support of our faithful partners, we raised \$23,398.55 for Missions, Outreach, and Benevolence. Praise God! As a church, we invested much more than we raised. Our goal is to give 10 percent of our Tithes and Offering income to Missions, Outreach, and Benevolence. This year we gave...drumroll please...\$91,952.73...14.4% to propagate the gospel of Jesus Christ and to support the needs of hurting families both locally and globally. We praise God for His direction in caring for His church. As we sow into His good work, He will continue to minister seed to the sower.

I would like to give special thanks to Rev. Marie King for assembling a missions team to support our church in Dominican Republic which serviced more than 200 people in the small village of Palmerito. Along with ministry, we provided beans, rice, cooking oil, clothing, monetary resources, and a large celebratory feast for all who attended. Praise God!

Free Market, Love in Action, and Jireh's Table: Combining the efforts of our Good Friday Free Market, Love in Action, and Jireh's Table, we provided FREE groceries to 1,800 families in 2018. Wow! Based on the average family size, we serviced more than 8,100 people who needed free groceries!

Nuts and Bolts: Our local outreach efforts have produced great fruit. This year alone, 247 connection cards were filled out, 154 decisions were made for Christ (including funeral services), 12 baptized in water, and 56 new partners were added to our fellowship! Hallelujah!

Impact Dollars: Thank you partners for \$69,274.75 in Impact Giving! With your support, we were able to fund our daycare renovation, carpet, and stage renovation. We paid off our Equipment lease for Worship Arts. Additionally, we paid off our 15-passenger van. Praise God!

2019: Our Year of Increase

2019 is our year of INCREASE: MEGA and MOBILE! We will experience bigger and better...and we will go farther and faster! There is nothing that can stop us from pursuing and receiving all that God has for us. Here's our vision for 2019:

Daycare Expansion: With God's help, we'll be launching our infants and toddlers' classrooms in our daycare. The renovations have been completed. We're waiting on our inspection. Special thanks to Min. Angela Riley, Bro. Johnny Houston, Bro. Sherman Simms, Bro. Kevin Walker, and Deacon Doug Joyner for assisting with the renovation. God bless you all!

IMPACT ONE: The Lord is changing our name to match our identity: IMPACT ONE! IMPACT ONE falls under the New Life Worship Center Inc umbrella in which we have our group exemption status. We'll do business as IMPACT ONE and all future church plants in the United States will carry this name. We're IMPACTing the world, ONE life at a time!

One Church, Two Campuses: We're elated about launching our second campus this year. To complement the life-changing ministry that's taking place in Capitol Heights, MD, we will launch IMPACT ONE ONLINE this year. Led by Lady Melanie Wilder, our e-campus will reach millions for Jesus Christ! Along with a virtual sanctuary, small groups, and e-partner training, IMPACT ONE ONLINE will provide seamless ministry channels that will help us propagate the gospel of Jesus Christ and impact the world in ways IMPACT ONE, Capitol Heights could not. We're stretching beyond 20743...and we're going to the uttermost parts of the world.

Impact Giving: Using the revenue raised by impact giving, we plan to complete renovations and ministry upgrades in our bathrooms, sanctuary, playground, meeting rooms, front doors, and security systems. Our goal is to raise \$200,000 in impact giving to make it all happen. If every partner sows an impact seed every week, we'll exceed our goal.

Secretary's Report

New Life Worship Center's 2018 Annual Business Meeting was officiated by the Chairperson, Lead Pastor, Juan Wilder and the Vice Chairperson, Deacon Brian Dorsey. The Official Board was invited to the platform. Deacons Reginald Carnegie and Stan Ruth were not in attendance.

TELLER'S REPORT

Kimberly Cobb, the Teller Captain, presented the following Teller's Report:

A motion was made by Rev. Marie King and seconded by Karen Yates to receive the Teller's Report as given. The motion passed.

CALL TO ORDER

A motion was made by Linda Black and seconded by Tedra Long to call the meeting to order. The motion passed. The meeting was called to order at 7:56 p.m.

SPECIAL MOTIONS

A motion was made by Chassidy Brison and seconded by Rev. Marie King to suspend the agenda. The motion passed. A motion was made by Rev. Marie King and seconded by Rev. Richard Lewis to suspend the reading of the staff reports, with the exception of the Pastor's, Secretary's and Treasurer's Reports. The motion passed.

PASTOR'S REPORT

The chair was turned over to Deacon Dorsey so that Pastor Juan could present the Pastor's Report. Pastor Juan asked if there were any questions. There were none. A motion was made by Karen Yates and seconded by Tedra Long to accept the Pastor's Report as read. The motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS

Sale of Properties at 7400 and 7402 Central Avenue

A company has been sending us letters and emails asking if we are willing to sell the properties. They asked how much we wanted for the properties, which include the Ministry House and a piece of land next to it, totaling 52,000 square feet. Together they are valued at \$200,000. She offered \$1.3 million. Pastor discussed this with the Board, and we submitted a counteroffer of \$1.475 million, because we knew there would be some closing costs involved which we would have to pay. We would walk away from the table with a minimum of \$1.37 million. There are three properties they are trying to acquire for a prominent gas station. One property (on the corner) belongs to the state of Maryland, for which they already have a contract. There is a third property which is the Massante property. Once they acquire that contract, everything will be final. We negotiated that price because we need to have at least 20% of the amount of the loan we want to build the Life Center. This amount is about 25%. Once all sales are complete, we will be in the position to build the Life Center within 15 to 18 months. Our contract has been revised, voted on by the Board and signed by one of the Trustees. The congregation needs to vote on this. While we are in the process of selling, they will allow us to utilize the house.

NEW BUSINESS CONTINUED

Pastor Juan asked if there were any questions. There were: Jamaal Morse—Given the current offer, why did we not make an offer for the full amount of the Life Center? Pastor Juan stated that they would not have accepted that counteroffer. Kwame Brown had three questions: (1) When is the closing date? Pastor stated that there is no closing date because there is a feasibility period and permits have to be pulled. Everything has to be approved and all three properties have to be under contract. The average time frame for all three contracts is 18 months. (2) How much money is going to be put in escrow? Pastor stated \$40,000. (3) Is that what they offered? Pastor explained that the original amount was \$25,000. We wanted more in our pockets in case they walked away. Karen Yates asked if they would be putting any types of pipes or tubes under our property. Pastor said no, there would be no environmental issues. These types of issues will be addressed during the feasibility period. Chassidy Brison asked if the other daycare was going to be torn down. Pastor Juan stated that he did not know, but they are not one of the properties under consideration. The congregation received ballots to vote on the sale of the properties. Pastor Juan offered prayer. The ballots were marked and collected. The ballot was closed.

SECRETARY'S REPORT

The Secretary's Report was presented by Board Secretary, Adrienne Parker. Pastor asked if there were any questions. There were none. A motion was made by Chassidy Brison and seconded by Linda Huff to accept the Secretary's Report as given. The motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS CONTINUED

Sale of Properties at 7400 and 7402 Central Avenue

Kimberly Cobb presented the results of the vote. There were 65 yes and 5 no votes.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Treasurer Maurice Tobias presented the Treasurer's Report. He thanked Bethany McGraw and Tina King for their assistance in preparing the financial reports. He discussed some highlights from the reports. On page 38, the Balance Sheet as of December 31, 2017, shows Operating Cash of \$56,786 and Prepaid Expenses of \$3,977, totaling \$60,763 in Current Assets.

It shows a loss in net income of \$13,806. The Profit and Loss Budget vs. Actual statement for the year showed that tithes and offerings received totaled \$635,859.83, which was below the budgeted amount of \$660,000.

Compensation and benefits were increased for the Worship Arts Ministry and staff. Rev. Marie King was hired to focus on the Outreach Ministry. Benevolence, which appears on page 41, is used to address the needs of the congregation and others. A total of \$4,590 was received, but expenses totaled \$9,381.40. Expenses for the Missions Ministry, which includes the Outreach Ministry, guest speakers, the Free Market and missions totaled \$72,611.58. The budgeted amount was \$43,209.94. General Ministry included our Wednesday Night Refuel/Refire Service, refreshments, hospitality, leadership summits, etc. We continued to invest in the community even though we operated in a deficit. We paid down the Worship Arts equipment and paid Bob Nitz \$2,000 per month. Treasurer Tobias asked if there were any questions. Dr. Emma Alexander asked what was covered under Property: 814.03.06 Other, on page 42, totaling \$10,024.32? Treasurer Tobias explained that this was related to the Daycare's portion of the vehicle-related expenses of one of the leased vehicles. She also asked what is covered under General Church 803.20 Miscellaneous? This includes expenses related to special events at the church and other items that were not easily categorized into one of the other ministerial or general church categories. Pastor Juan stated that this also includes activities and programs not in a category. Some of the items should have been under Benevolence. There were legal and visa fees for Bishop Ben. These expenses were not allocated because he and his family arrived in the middle of the year. What is included under General Church, 803.08 Bank Fees-Other, which totaled \$18,920,19? These are merchant fees we incur for online payments through easyTithe and for Daycare online payments.

Pastor Juan stated that the staff salaries were increased by 30% to 35% so that they could compete with salaries in the area. Everyone received an increase except for Pastor Juan. There will be a difference in the housing allowance. Dr. McGraw will not be receiving a housing allowance. The depreciation amounts are accurate. The equipment will be paid off in June. A motion was made by Rev. Marie King and seconded by Linda Huff to accept the Treasurer's Report as given. The motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS CONTINUED

Ratification of Proposed 2018 Budget

Pastor Juan asked if there were any questions. Garrett Alexander asked what was 803.13.01 Wireless on page 51? Treasurer Tobias stated that it is the amount we pay for internet access and data lines. Pastor Juan stated that we have Verizon and AT&T. This includes Pastor Juan's cellphone (which is a business expense because he is required to be on call), a portion of Johnny Houston's cellphone because he is our facilities manager, and telephones in the church. Rev. Tracey Lewis stated that she did not see anything for Assimilation and the Connections Pastors for gifts, etc. Pastor Juan stated that it is on page 49 under Assimilation/Pastoral Care, 821.06 Gifts (Visitors, etc.). It is an expense, which is the amount that they have to spend. Pastor Juan stated that, based on the budget, we will be operating in the black by \$64,034.06. We are going to believe God for more. Linda Huff stated that on page 52, under 804.10 Vehicles, the proposed budgeted amount is \$14,904. Treasurer Tobias explained that we have two vehicles, and this is the amount we pay for the leases, gas and maintenance. We share this expense with the Daycare. Pastor Juan stated that we are leasing to own one of the vans, and in September, it will be paid off, and it will be ours. We decided to purchase it outright, which will decrease our costs, and in 2019, we will not have to incur that expense. Garrett Alexander asked the difference between items 803.25 Network/ISP and 803.13.02 Land Lines/DSL, found on page 51. Treasurer Tobias explained that Land Lines/DSL is the internet connectivity in the church. Network/ISP is the cost we incur for hosting the website. Pastor Juan stated that, because this is causing some confusion, we will make the descriptions clearer so that everyone can understand each category. Pastor stated that we have website hosting, telephones from AT&T that require internet access to operate, and have acquired different systems to upgrade the former telephone system that was not working. A motion was made by Chassidy Brison and seconded by Phyllis Easter to accept the 2018 Proposed Budget as given. The motion passed.

The chair was turned over to Deacon Dorsey so that Pastor Juan could address additional items on the agenda.

One Church, Two Locations (Locally)

We are still launching the ministry. We are just waiting on the Lord. We believe it is better to take care of one thing at a time than to have too many irons in the fire and stress ourselves financially. Once we are finished with the illegal dumping and the musical equipment has been paid off, we will be able to incur the expense of a church plant.

When we incur the expense for the church plant, we will still be operating in the black because we will have \$4,000 (the expense for the musical equipment) and the money we spent for the illegal dumping to put in a pool to use for the church plant.

Closeout of Illegal Dumping (Final Proposal)

We have our final proposal of \$56,000, which is all we need to pay for the trash to be removed.

The Importance of Impact Giving

Some partners have been asking what they owe for Faith Promises. Letters will be sent out for the remaining Faith Promises. We want to close out Faith Promises because they will be no more. We will transition to Impact Giving, which is more of a free-hearted, liberal giving. It is our position that Impact Giving will exceed Faith Promises. We believe that if you support the vision, you will give cheerfully. Pastor Juan wants us to commit to giving an Impact offering every week. That is how we will have the provision for the vision. If we do so, we will have the resources for our free markets, church plants, makeovers for our bathrooms and daycare, and repairs to the roof and parking lot.

Prayer for Officers and Church

Lady Melanie Wilder offered prayer for the leaders, officers and the Church.

MOTION TO ADJOURN

A motion to adjourn was made by Shanita Graves and seconded by Linda Mercer. The motion passed. The meeting was adjourned at 9:23 p.m.

Missions Pastor's Report

What a privilege it is to serve at this great church! Where impacting the lives of others is not just a motto but, a way of doing ministry that permeates every facet of what we do!

In an attempt to trick Jesus into saying something that the Jewish leaders could use against him, Jesus was asked this question: "Master, which is the great commandment in the law?" Jesus replied, "'You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, all your soul, and all your mind.

A second is equally important: Love your neighbor as yourself. The entire law and all the demands of the prophets are based on these two commandments." Matthew 22:37, 39-40. I believe this scripture is the basis for everything that we do. The things we accomplished in 2018 were a reflection of our love for God and for our neighbor.

In February, we launched our monthly food distribution program, now called "Jireh's Table". Partnering with Reverend Wil Stroman of Urban Outreach, we are now assisting an average of 15 families who need support with groceries. We'd like to thank Reverend Glenn who has also donated a variety of meats on a regular basis. In April, we sponsored a Good Friday Free Market providing 6000lbs of fresh produce, 522 hams, 400 turkeys and over 30,000lbs of other grocery items. The most amazing thing happened on that Palm Sunday as our partners filled the altar with bags of groceries to be given away. Their sacrifices **will not** go unrewarded! We served almost 1,000 families for the Glory of God.

Love in Action occurred in August with Evangelist Gerald "Fire Shut Up in My Bones" Mayhan. Again, our partners came through with helping us in effort to provide school supplies for children in our neighborhood. The community came out in large numbers to enjoy the moon bounces, hotdogs, free food, etc. The gospel was preached and souls were saved.

We continued our efforts to share the love of God in our community by continuing regular visits to Collington Nursing Home and Brookdale Nursing Home under the leadership of Kathy Foster. Thanks to her and the team who faithfully love on these seniors.

We also assisted Urban Outreach at the Pregnancy Center parenting program. Once a month we served the participants a hearty meal and shared words of encouragement. Thanks to Karrie Boone and Tanequa Lee for being transparent with the participants and letting them know that they can do all things through Christ; that Jesus loves them; and that Jesus is the answer. Thanks, especially to Mother Elizabeth Simms, Kelli Potter, Mireya Munoz-King, and those who are faithful to help in this ministry.

Finally, a small team traveled to the Dominican Republic to bless Pastor Rosa and the children and families at Nueva Viva (New Life). They were not able to get the VISAS needed for them to travel here so, we wanted them to know they were not forgotten. Pastor Juan was in his element as the children were fed a wonderful meal and then treated with all the candy they could eat.

2018 was a very fruitful year for missions and outreach but, there is so much more to do to demonstrate the love of God to those in our neighborhoods, our country, and throughout the world. Please welcome Bishop Louis Ben as he comes on board to help expand our evangelism program. We need your talent, your hands, and your prayers as we continue to impact the world one life at a time.

Thank you, Pastor Juan for the liberty to grow and learn along with the life lessons that you teach.

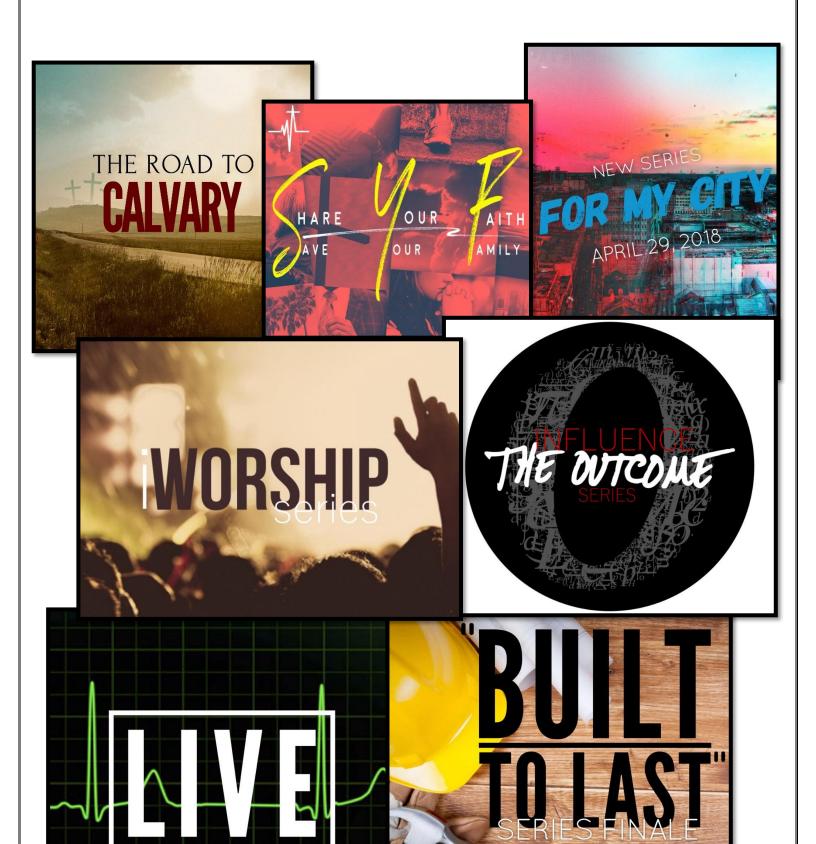
To my *favoritist* in the whole world, Pastor Mel, thank you for being a sounding board at 7:30 in the morning. It's always a blessing!
