


November 2021



I would like, in this article, to quote some lines from Tim Tennent's book, For the Body, which we are using in our current WD2 study on Wednesday evenings. One theme in particular has caused me to "sit up and take notice", as they say.

We are now over 1 ½ years into this Covid pandemic. This pandemic has caused us to scramble to "be the church" during some times when physically attending church was difficult or impossible. Hopefully, prayerfully, we are moving out of the worst of the crisis. I think we may all be thankful that we were able to develop a worship service that could be viewed from the safety of your own home. Someone was just telling me how they found it to be really "easy" to sit in their pajamas with a cup of coffee and "go to church". As we slowly move back into coming to worship in person, I wonder if there aren't some who find it difficult to get out of the "easy" way and have just continued to "go to church" in their living rooms... or perhaps not at all.

Here is the passage from Tennent's book that started me thinking about this:

". . . the Apostle's Creed declares that Jesus was 'born of the Virgin Mary' and 'suffered under Pontius Pilate,' this creedal affirmation reminds us that the central act of redemption happened bodily and in human history. The Nicene Creed says it even more clearly when it speak of Jesus, 'who for us and for our salvation came down from heaven and was incarnate by the Holy Spirit of the Virgin Mary and was made man.' The word 'incarnation', meaning 'in the flesh,' establishes embodiment as the foundation of our redemption. Jesus did not send us an email telling us how much he loved us; he came and lived among us (John 1:14). The incarnation of Jesus affirms that our primary presentation of Christ to the world should be through embodied presence.

Second, the Apostle's Creed also celebrates the 'communion of the saints.' When we gather, we gather as the church, which includes those present today as well as those who have already departed (through death) to join the church triumphant. We physically gather, and our connection to the saints in heaven is mystical, NOT virtual. The importance of physically meeting together is reaffirmed by the writer of Hebrews when he admonishes Christian believers to 'not give up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing' (Heb. 10:25). This does not mean that the church should avoid digital technology. To be clear, digital technology can assist us in our mission in many ways. However, we should never speak or act as if a digital presentation is equivalent to embodiment.'

I realize that I have somewhat taken this passage out of the larger context of Tennent's book, but I believe it also applies to the concern that I have that some of us may have become overly comfortable with not attending in person. I believe that our gathering together builds and grows a Christian fellowship and discipleship which cannot be achieved any other way. If you continue to be frightened of contracting Covid, I certainly understand. But if that is not so much the case, then I hope to see you, physically, in worship again soon!

OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD

November 15-22 is National Collection Week for Operation Christmas Child. Christ Church will serve again as the Warren County Drop-off Location for shoebox gifts.



Operation Christmas Child is a project of the international relief organization, Samaritan's Purse, in which a donor fills a shoebox with small gifts for a child. The mission of Operation Christmas Child is to provide local partners around the world with shoeboxes filled with small toys, hygiene items, and school supplies as a means of reaching out to children in their own communities with the Good News of Jesus Christ in their own language. These simple gifts are shipped internationally to children affected by war, poverty, natural disaster, famine and disease; and to children living on Native American reservations in the U.S. The \$9 donation needed for each box covers the cost of shipping and the gospel materials included in each box.

You can be a part of this ministry by packing a shoebox gift or gifts.
