




what is a discipleship pathway?



beloved: exploring a relationship with Christ

Welcome! We are so glad you are here as you embark on your faith journey.

Do you wonder what it means to be a beloved child of God? Have you experienced road blocks in your path that are leading you to investigate how Jesus can guide you? Do you question how the church can impact your life? Have you had negative past experiences that lead you to doubt the community?





ATTEND WORSHIP SERVICES

St. Stephen's has weekly Sunday services at 8:30 & 11 a.m. Join us as regularly as you can! In our 8:30 a.m. service, we sing praise songs, celebrate communion every week, and worship together with a casual, relaxed feel. Our 11 a.m. worship service includes hymns and a more structured order of worship.

EXPERIENCE THE ST. STEPHEN'S COMMUNITY

You have accepted Jesus into your heart and know you belong.

You are starting to embrace prayer, Bible study, and leaning on others in your faith community. You regularly attend Sunday school and church services, but your commitment to Christ is concentrated on church activities. You give to the church and the community with both time and resources, but rarely share your faith with others.





SERVE

Fill out the "my discipleship pathway" form with your interests, and someone will be in touch to help you make service to God and community part of your routine.

TAKE YOUR BIBLE STUDY TO A NEW LEVEL

Participate in a Bible study group! We have women's studies, men's studies, short-term studies throughout the year, and much more! Look at the groups page on our website for more details.

READ SCRIPTURE DAILY

There are several great smartphone apps (check the resources guide in this book), or you could buy a bible with a built-in devotion guide, but making scripture reading a part of your daily practice can really transform your life.

DEVELOP SPIRITUAL PRACTICES THAT WORK FOR YOU

Take some time to find the spiritual practices that work for you! There are many different ones that ground people: prayer or meditation, reading a daily devotional, journaling, or art making.

BECOME A REGULAR GIVER

Making financial support of the church into a regular or recurring event is an act of praise and commitment that helps you grow. There's no "correct" dollar amount, but give in a way that is meaningful to you.

building: close to Christ

You are building a relationship with Jesus and making it a part of your everyday life.

You feel confident in God's presence and power and connect with God daily through personal spiritual practices. Your faith is beginning to shape your routine, attitude, and how you approach decisions and situations. You seek to serve others in the community. Your actions and your words show your relationship with Christ.





TAKE ON A LEADERSHIP ROLE IN YOUR SERVING

We all have gifts and skills that make us unique. Start praying about and exploring the ways you can use your own gifts and skills to bless the church and the greater community.

SEEK RELATIONSHIPS WITH NEW PEOPLE

Whether they are new to a relationship with Jesus or just new to St. Stephen's, you are called to help them learn, grow, and belong.

READ BOOKS THAT HELP YOU GROW SPIRITUALLY

Challenge yourself to read things that help to stretch and form your faith. Look at the suggested resources at the end of this booklet, or visit the church library.

DEVELOP YOUR ABILITY TO TELL THE STORY OF WHAT GOD HAS DONE IN YOUR LIFE

God has done incredible things in, for, and through you. Share your personal story about that God and you will bring new people to faith and help build the Kingdom.

WORK TOWARDS TITHING

Tithing, or giving ten percent of your income to the church, is a significant sacrifice that requires a big shift in priorities for most people. Consider making a plan to give sacrificially.

transforming: Christ-centered

You have been transformed by the love of Jesus, and you have surrendered to Him.

You love others as Christ loves you and Jesus is your guiding light. You are comfortable witnessing about God's love and no longer rely on the Church to provide opportunities to serve others. You look for opportunities to challenge your spiritual growth and mentor others on their journey.





INVEST IN PEOPLE

Transforming Christians are leaders who make more leaders. Help those you know to grow and to take on more leadership and service themselves.

BUILD SOMETHING NEW

Use the gifts and skills you have to birth new ministries, write devotionals, and create opportunities for others to grow and serve.

EXPLORE GOD'S CALL ON YOUR LIFE

God calls all of us, and God is calling you to something incredible. Consider courses or seminars in theology or lay ministry, spiritual retreats, serving as a missionary, or possibly ministry as a vocation.

GO AND TELL WHAT GOD HAS DONE

On your journey to this stage of faith, you learned how to give your testimony. Now, it is your turn to tell that story and to teach others how to do the same.

MAKE CHRIST-CENTERED FINANCIAL CHOICES

Making financial decisions that start from a place of faith is a counter-cultural act of surrender to God. Consider what it means to put Christ first in all things, including finances, and take steps to accomplish those goals.
