Summer Recap

Wow! What a bumper summer we had at St. Stephen's. It all started out on June 13th as nine of our students, and three adults travelled to Lakeview Summer Camp. While there they swam, danced, crafted, ate LOTS of snacks, worshipped, competed, nerfed, played, and more. When our group returned they were eager for two things. Rest and to go back again next summer. And we will. Stay tuned.

Our VBS had 108 children registered and was a wonderful week learning about how God loves us and provides for our needs. We enjoyed our Food Truck Party with crafts, games, songs, dances, stories, snacks, and a trip to the ever popular Bible Village. A big word of thanks to the over fifty volunteers who were so talented and bring VBS to life in the most amazing way.

UM ARMY came next with the St. Stephen's group 32 strong. All of the youth and adults who travelled to Crockett worked in the most difficult of conditions with no break from the relentless heat. We had AC problems, storms that knocked out the power, and supply issues (because we bought all of the deck boards in the county) and yet, it was the hardest working group in recent memory and they did not complain. The Crockett camp built over 180 feet of wheelchair ramps, constructed 9 elevated porches, helped preserve the structure of a nearly 200 year old church, and so much more. Most of all, they left Crockett a better place than when they arrived and gave hope to some deserving folks.

High Voltage Rock Camp in their tenth year held their camp in Oak Forest for the first time at St. Stephen's and broke their all time attendance record. The kids who registered were put into bands and by the end of the week had come up with band names, logos, t-shirts, and during the live concert in our Fellowship Hall on Friday night, performed a cover of a famous song and debuted an original song composed and written that week! Seeing talented kids do the things that they are talented at is always a joy and it's even better when it happens here at St. Stephen's

Fine Arts Camp returned to our summer schedule for the first time since 2019 and 18 K-6th graders took part in art, music, dance, and drama classes. At the end of the camp, they performed their musical, dance, and drama pieces, and had their artwork exhibited around the sanctuary.

Family Ministries also held events with Westbury and St. Mark's doing a service project for a food pantry. We joined our friends at St. Matthew's for an afternoon of bowling. And we partnered with Terrace UMC to assist one another in our summer VBS.

And if all of that wasn't enough, Julie Osterman's Musical Theater Camp is back for its second year starting on August 8th!

Phew, I'm tired all over again just reading that.



GriefShare - A special GriefShare seminar, "Loss of a Spouse" will be held August 16 at 6pm in Room 101. The seminar will include a 35-minute video with encouraging, practical advice from pastors, counselors, and widowed men and women, followed by a time of sharing with others who have lost a spouse. Everyone who attends will receive a booklet with more than 30 short readings on how to live with grief and eventually rebuild your life.

GriefShare is a weekly seminar and support group for people who are grieving the death of someone close to them. Each session includes a video teaching on grief recovery followed by a time of sharing in a small group setting. Sessions will begin Tuesday, August 30, at 6pm in Room 101.
