November Recap from Our JMS Hallways

Since Halloween (and the day after) fell on a school day this year, we added a fun tradition of Pajama Day on November 1 - the students and teachers loved having a quiet day after all that Halloween excitement! The first few November days after Halloween are also when we collect left-over candy for our Treats for Troops program; I am so happy to report that we beat last year's donation (114.6lbs) by dropping off 134.6lbs this year. Our students also participated in an optional speech and language screening with a local Speech Pathologist. By identifying possible delays in articulation or expressive language, we aim to encourage early intervention because a little bit of help can make a world of difference before heading off to Kindergarten.

One of our favorite fall traditions is the Thanksgiving Chapel and Feast. Each child brought a canned good to donate to the food drive for local families and placed them in a bin at the start of our chapel time together. Our JMS families were all invited to join us for

lunch afterwards in the Fellowship Hall; each class prepared a menu item and contributed them to the buffet for all JMS students to enjoy. We had enough mashed potatoes to feed all of Oak Forest - the students loved peeling potatoes!



The fall field trip this year was a little closer than what we've done in the past - we headed up to Humble to explore Old MacDonald Farm. Our parent chaperones were a huge help as the kids enjoyed playtime on a giant sand pile, explored in the playground tunnels, fed pigs, bunnies and goats, and experienced a horse ride for the first time for many! However, the highlight of the trip for most kids was getting to ride on an actual big yellow school bus. What a special memory and what confidence-building skills they all worked on by being away from familiar places like school and home - we are so proud of our students.

Registration for the 2024-2025 school year will be underway soon. If you are a church member or a returning family (even if there has been a gap between siblings), you always qualify for early registration between Feb 1-29.
