1.	Why do you think Peter describes Jesus as someone who will cause unbelieving people to stumble and fall? (1 Peter 2:7-8; Isaiah 8:14)
2.	What does 1 Peter 2:9-10 teach us about ourselves and God?
3.	Does Peter tell his readers to stay away from sinful desires because that is what is causing their suffering? (1 Peter 2:11-12) Why or why not?
4.	What does it look like to submit ourselves "to every human authority"? (1 Peter 2:13-17) Should we submit to leaders even if we don't like their political positions? (Romans 13:1-5)

5. Read Psalm 23. The LORD, our Shepherd, *continually causes* us to lie down in green pastures, He *continually leads* us beside quiet waters, He *continually refreshes* our soul and He *continually guides* us along right paths. How does knowing that we have a Shepherd who continually does these things help us to better understand God and our relationship with Him in light of our suffering?
