

# Sermon on the Mount Sermon Notes - Part 22 Title: There's Wisdom in Hesitation June 29th, 2025

### **Main Scriptures:**

Matthew 7:1-6; James 1:19-20; Exodus 34:6-7;
Colossians 4:5-6; 1 Corinthians 5:12-13

- 1. Understanding "Do Not Judge" (Matthew 7:1-2)
  - Clarification: Jesus isn't saying "never judge." He's saying "never condemn"
  - **Reflection:** *Discernment* helps people grow in grace. *Condemnation* tears people down.
  - General Definition: "Judge" = to discern or evaluate to form an opinion and then act on it
  - **Bible Study Tip:** We're meant to interpret "Do not judge" through the parable and proverb-like wisdom that follows
- 2. The Plank & the Speck (Matthew 7:3-5)
  - The kind of judgement Jesus warns about is condemnation
    - Condemnation belongs to God 1 Corinthians 5:12-13
  - (v5) "Take the plank out of your own eye" Evaluate ourselves first!
  - What Now? Jesus doesn't command us to remove the speck...
    - (v5) "remove" (Greek = ekbalein): an "infinitive of potential"
      - It's something we *might* do, but it's not *required*
  - Reflection: Clarity doesn't always lead to correction. Sometimes it leads to compassion, restraint, or prayer. Our job isn't to fix someone, it's to love them.
- → There's wisdom in hesitation—it's a practice of humble discernment, not condemnation. We should be very hesitant to speak our minds when we see a speck in someone else's eye.

### **3. The Pearls and the Pigs** (Matthew 7:6)

- Reflection: Judging from pride leads to distorted discernment
- **Jewish Context:** "pearls" = wisdom; "dogs/pigs" = outsiders
  - rabbis taught that God's commands were for Israel's eyes only (their interpretation of Psalm 147:19-20)
  - Jesus challenged this! He's saying: Be careful not to throw God's wisdom at people who aren't ready to hear it; especially when we haven't looked at ourselves first!
    - Colossians 4:5-6 be wise; full of grace
    - 1 Corinthians 5:12-13 it's God's job to judge, not ours!
- Reflection: If we want to represent Jesus well, then we need to love others enough to not "judge"

#### 4. The Heart of the Matter

- Exodus 34:6-7 This is the *heart* behind the Sermon on the Mount
- James 1:19 This is the *posture* of Matthew 7:1-6
- **Consider This:** When we stop rushing to condemn and start listening with humility, we begin to love like Jesus.

"Once contempt is gone, empathy, love, and concern can thrive in our hearts."
