

Sermon on the Mount Sermon Notes - Part 28 Title: Ready for the Storm August 10th, 2025

Main Scriptures: Matthew 7:24-27; Matthew 24:36-44; Psalm 18:2; Isaiah 43:1-3 **Main Idea:** Wisdom isn't just hearing Jesus' words—it's putting them into practice before the storm hits.

- 1. Where we've been (Matthew 5:1-7:23)
 - Jesus **redefines** the good life (blessed)
 - Jesus' Word **reshapes** us to reflect God's heart with a greater righteousness
 - The narrowing road refines us—inviting us to check our heart

→ The truths we build our lives on actually matter

Note: Jesus' words *activate* Old Testament scenes like a *hyperlink* opening a whole story in the minds of His listeners. Today we'll look at two: the house on the rock and the storm.

- **2. Image #1 the <u>house</u> on the <u>rock</u> (Matthew 7:24, 26)**
 - (v24) "wise man" naturally activates King Solomon (2 Chronicles 1)
 - The <u>Temple</u> is often called the <u>House</u> of God (Psalm 65:4)
 - o **Temple #1** Built by Solomon the glory of the LORD filled the Temple
 - destroyed by Babylon years later God's people in exile
 - Temple #2 Rebuilt, but no mention of the LORD filling the Temple
 - elders wept—it was nothing like the first (Ezra 3:12, Haggai 2:3)
 - Temple #2.1 Renovated by Herod the Great
 - *still* no record of God's glory filling the Temple
 - the hearts of the religious leaders mirrored the Temple—impressive on the outside, empty on the inside (Matthew 23:27, 38)
 - → Outward impressiveness isn't a **foundation**—obedience to Jesus is
 - Our true foundation is God Himself, our Rock (Psalm 18:2)

3. Image #2 - the storm (Matthew 7:25, 27)

- "The streams **rose**" = "the rivers **came**" (literal translation)
 - This was a warning—sudden flash floods were a familiar real life illustration for those listening to Jesus on the hillside
- "the rivers came" naturally activates Noah's Flood (Genesis 6-8)
 - Noah's "house" stayed above the flood because it was built according to God's Word (see Matthew 7:24)

→ Hearing + Doing (for the right reasons) = **Building**

Consider This: Matthew 7:24-27 isn't just *wisdom*, it's a *warning*. Jesus is encouraging His listeners to not be caught unaware.

4. Will we recognize Jesus?

- (Luke 19:42-44) The very presence of God—Jesus, the Word became flesh—is finally walking back into the Temple. But the tragedy is that His own people didn't recognize Him.
 - Their empty, whitewashed hearts culminated in another "flood"—Jerusalem's destruction in 70 AD
 - Are we living unaware of God's presence?

→ No matter how strong the storm is, **Jesus**, our steadfast hope, **anchors us**

5. Reflection Questions

- What's my real foundation right now—what do I actually trust in the storm?
 (God, money, reputation, control, a person, etc)
- What's one part of my life built on "sand"? What's one step I can make this week to move it onto the Rock? (prayer, forgiveness, generosity, surrender, etc)
- READ: Isaiah 43:1-3 How does this passage encourage you in the storms?
- PRAY: Lord, please show me one place I'm building on sand—and give me the courage to move it onto the Rock.
