

Part 3 - Light Up the Battlefield

November 23, 2025

Scripture: 1 Samuel 2:12-36

Main Idea: Even when God's house is covered in darkness, God raises up a light. The question is whether we will join or ignore Him.

The greatest spiritual threat we face is becoming so desensitized to darkness that we no longer recognize the evil around us.

- 1. Recognize the Darkness (Eli's Sons 1 Samuel 2:12-17)
 - Eli's Sons:
 - "Sons of worthlessness."
 - "They knew not Yahweh."
 - o Took God's portion for themselves.
 - Treated the LORD's offering with contempt (v17).
- 2. Contrast: Worthless Priests vs. Faithful Samuel (1 Samuel 2:18–21, 26)
 - Samuel:
 - Ministered before the LORD as a boy.
 - Grew "in stature and in favor with the LORD and with people."
 - The LORD was with him.
 - Eli's Sons:
 - Grown men, seasoned priests... but the LORD was not with them.
 - Spiritually dead.
- 3. Our Response Matters (1 Samuel 2:22-26)
 - Eli stayed silent → darkness spread
 - Ordinary moments become spiritual warfare when we speak truth instead of choosing silence

4. God Confronts Corrupt Leadership (1 Samuel 2:27-30)

- "a man of God" rebukes Eli:
 - Eli and sons <u>scorned</u> God's offering (ba'at = "to kick, despise").
 - o God withdraws the priestly promise from Eli's house.
- **Key Truth:** God does not honor those who despise Him.

5. Judgment Comes After Patience (1 Samuel 2:31-34)

- They had been committing these sins for years.
- God was patient, but they refused to turn back.
- "Those who oppose the LORD will be broken" (Hannah, 2:10).
- God takes no pleasure in judgment (Ezek 33:11).

6. God Raises Up A Faithful Priest (1 Samuel 2:35)

- Layers of Fulfillment:
 - Near: Eli's line replaced; a new priestly house (Zadok, 1 Kings 2:35).
 - Ultimate: Jesus, the faithful High Priest.
 - Ongoing: His "priestly house" = the Church (that's us!)

7. Our Identity as Priests (Hebrews 3:6; 1 Peter 2:9; Revelation 1:6)

- Every follower of Jesus is a priest. We're called to represent God to the world... right here, right now.
- Darkness must be confronted with Light
 - Jesus already disarmed the powers of evil (Colossians 2:15)
 - He calls us to advance His Kingdom (Matthew 16:18)

As long as the world still has darkness, we're called to shine the light of Jesus on the battlefield.

8. Going Deeper:

- READ Ephesians 5:11-13. What areas of my life am I tempted to stay silent instead of confronting darkness with the Light of Jesus?
- READ Matthew 5:14-16, Romans 12:21, Colossians 2:15. Where is God calling me to "light up the battlefield" this week (family, workplace, friendships, community)?
