

Our call today is simple yet profound: embrace the identity God has given you. You are a lighthouse in a world desperate for guidance, protection, and hope.

Jesus said in Matthew 5:14–16, "You are the light of the world." That means you're not here by accident - you're positioned on purpose, for a purpose. To shine through the darkness. To warn of danger. To be a beacon of hope.

But lighthouses don't run on autopilot. They need oil. They need clean glass. They need care. So do we. To shine, we need fresh oil from the Holy Spirit, and hearts kept clear from shame, failure, or distraction.

And lighthouses aren't built in easy places. They stand where storms rage and waves crash - but their foundation is the rock. Ours must be too in Christ and His Word.

This calling isn't about self-preservation or status. It's about serving, guiding, protecting. Every lighthouse is unique. So are you. Your light doesn't need comparison - it just needs to shine.

REFLECTION

Share something that stood out from the Sunday message 'Let there be light'.

MESSAGE POINTS

One: You Are the Light of the World

God has uniquely called each of us to be a lighthouse—guiding, directing, and shining His light in the places we are positioned. Just as a lighthouse stands tall to help others navigate through darkness and danger, so too are we called to bring clarity, hope, and direction to our families, workplaces, and communities. This is not about living on autopilot or relying on yesterday's supply, but about seeking a fresh encounter with God's presence each day, so that our light remains bright and our purpose clear. No matter how withered or dry you may feel, God desires to pour His living water into you, reviving your spirit and enabling you to shine for His glory.

Matthew 5:14-16 (ESV)

"You are the light of the world. A city set on a hill cannot be hidden. Nor do people light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a stand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven."

Discussion

Who are you becoming as the light of the world?

• Jesus didn't just say do good things, He said you are the light. How is following Jesus shaping who you are on the inside, not just what you do on the outside?

What threatens to dim your light?

• Every light can grow dim if it's not cared for. What things in your life—fear, busyness, distraction, sin, or tiredness—make it harder for God's light to shine through you? How can you guard against them?

How does your light bring glory to God, not yourself?

• Jesus said people will see our good works and give glory to the Father. How can we live in such a way that when people notice our light, it leads them closer to God rather than just seeing us as "good people"?

Two: Consistency and Reliability Reflect God's Character

A lighthouse is only effective if it shines consistently, regardless of the weather or season. In the same way, God calls us to be dependable and steadfast, reflecting His own unchanging faithfulness. This means not hiding our light out of fear, shame, or discouragement, but continually returning to God for a fresh supply and clearing away anything that clouds our witness. Our lives are meant to serve others, not ourselves, and our reliability can be a source of hope and stability for those around us.

Hebrews 13:8 (ESV)
"Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever."

Discussion

How does God's unchanging nature give us stability in a changing world?

• Hebrews 13:8 reminds us that Jesus is the same yesterday, today, and forever. How does His consistency bring you peace, and how can it shape the way you respond to challenges and uncertainties in life?

What makes it hard to be consistent in reflecting God's light?

• Just like a lighthouse has to shine in storms as well as calm weather, we're called to shine even in difficult times. What kinds of struggles—fear, shame, discouragement, or distraction—tend to cloud your light? How can we clear those things away?

How can our reliability point others to God's faithfulness?

• When people know they can trust us to show up with integrity and love, it reflects God's character. Can you share a time when someone's consistency encouraged your faith? What's one way you can be that steady light for others this week?

Three: Embrace Your Unique Light and Purpose

Every lighthouse has a unique pattern, and so does every person—comparison only clouds your calling. God has placed a distinct light within you, designed for a purpose that only you can fulfill. When life feels foggy or your vision seems unclear, remember that God's Spirit can bring clarity and direction. Rather than striving to be like someone else, embrace the unique way God has made you, and trust that your light—no matter how small it feels—can make a difference in the lives of others.

1 Corinthians 12:4-6 (ESV)

"Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of service, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who empowers them all in everyone."

Discussion

How does comparison dim the light God has placed in you?

• 1 Corinthians 12 reminds us that the same Spirit gives different gifts. Where do you find yourself tempted to compare your calling with others? How might comparison keep you from fully stepping into the unique way God has made you?

What unique light has God entrusted to you?

• Every lighthouse has its own pattern, and every believer has their own gift. What strengths, passions, or experiences has God given you that can serve others? How might these reflect His light in ways no one else could?

How can you embrace clarity when life feels foggy?

• Sometimes it's hard to see our purpose clearly, yet God's Spirit brings direction. In seasons of uncertainty, what helps you stay anchored to God's voice? How can the group encourage one another to trust the Spirit's guidance instead of striving to copy someone else's path?
