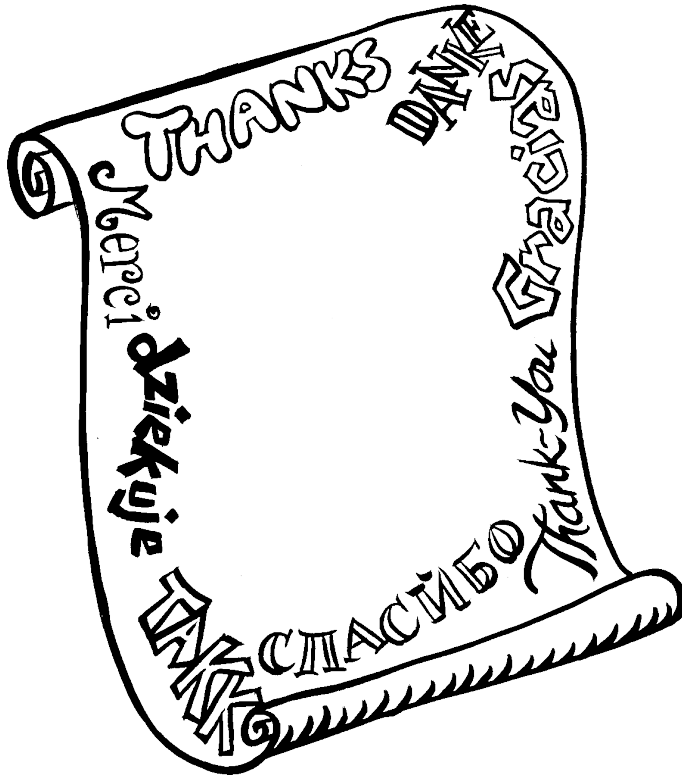

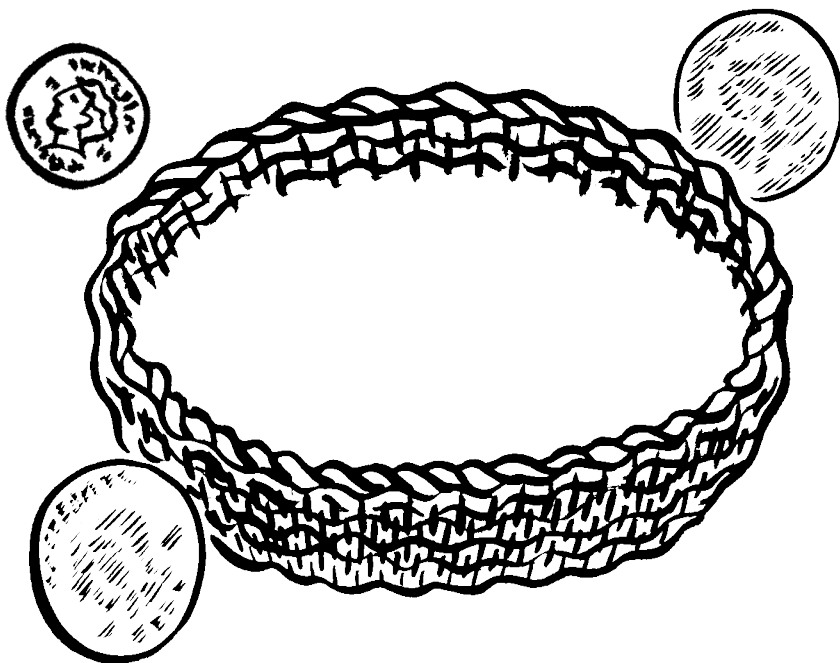
Welcome to worship! When we come to church, we say thank you to God for all kinds of things. What has God given you that you are thankful for?
