

+ SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM +

We are washed, forgiven, and claimed as God's children forever

INTRODUCTION

God, who is rich in mercy and love, gives us a new birth into a living hope through the sacrament of baptism. The power of sin is put to death in this holy flood, and we are raised with Jesus Christ to new life. We are united with all the baptized in the one body of Christ, anointed with the gift of the Holy Spirit, and sent out in mission for the world.

PRESENTATION

The sponsors, Matt and Chelsea Gorlaski, present the candidate for Baptism:

Sponsors: We present Cooper David Spadaro for baptism.

The presiding minister addresses parents, Thomas and Casey Spadaro:

Trusting in the grace and love of God, do you desire to have your child baptized?

Response: We do.

As you present Cooper for Holy Baptism, you are entrusted with gifts and responsibilities:

- -to bring him to services in God's house
- -to teach him the Lord's Prayer, the Apostles' Creed and the Ten Commandments
- -to provide him with the Holy Bible and instruction about it
- -to remind him of his Baptism and bring him to the Lord's Supper
- -to nurture him in faith, love, and compassion

Do you promise to help Cooper grow in the Christian faith and life?

Response: We do, with the help of God.

The presiding minister addresses the sponsors:

Sponsors, do you promise to nurture Cooper in the Christian faith as you are empowered by God's Spirit, and to help him live in the covenant of baptism and in communion with the church?

Response: We do, with the help of God.

The presiding minister addresses the congregation:

People of God, do you promise to support Cooper and to pray for his new life in Christ?

Response: We do.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

The presiding minister addresses the parents and sponsors:

P: I ask you to reject sin, profess your faith in Christ, and confess, together with your sisters and brothers, the faith of the Church.

Do you renounce the devil, and all the forces that defy God?

Response: I do renounce them.

Do you renounce the powers of this world that rebel against God?

Response: I do renounce them.

Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you away from God?

Response: I do renounce them.

The presiding minister addresses the congregation:

P: With the whole church in heaven and earth, let us confess our faith.

P: Do you believe in God the Father?

Response: I believe in God, the Father almighty,

creator of heaven and earth.

P: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

Response: I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord,

who was conceived by the Holy Spirit,

born of the virgin Mary,

suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried;

he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again;

he ascended into heaven,

he is seated at the right hand of the Father,

and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

P: Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

Response: I believe in the Holy Spirit,

the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body,

and the life everlasting. Amen

THE BAPTISM

THANKSGIVING

Standing at the font, the presiding minister begins the thanksgiving:

P: The Lord be with you.

C: And also with you.

P: Let us give thanks and praise.

C: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Blessed are you, holy God. You are the creator of the waters of the earth. You are the river of life. You led your people through the river Jordan and called them to life in covenant. Your Son was baptized in the river Jordan to begin his mission among us. Send your Holy Spirit into this water and into the baptized. Create us all anew that we may serve this needy world; for we trust in the name of Jesus, your Son, who lives with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever. **C: Amen**

BAPTISM

Water is poured on the candidate's head, as the presiding minister says:
Beloved child of God, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

C: Amen

SIGNING WITH THE CROSS

Child of God, you have been sealed by the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever. **C: Amen**

PRESENTATION OF BAPTISMAL GARMENT

"For all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ."

PRESENTATION OF A CANDLE

"Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven." (Matthew 5:16)






*WORDS OF INSTITUTION

*LORD'S PRAYER



COMMUNION

All baptized Christians who recognize the Lord's forgiveness and presence in Holy Communion are invited to receive the bread and wine. During the distribution, you are invited to come forward as directed by the ushers. Take a cup from the trays, and kneel or stand at the altar railing to receive the Bread and Wine. The first chalice is wine and the second chalice is grape juice. Gluten-free wafers are available upon request. Those who do not commune may come to the altar for a blessing, indicating so by crossing your arms. As the ministers give the bread and cup to you, they say these words: The body of Christ, given for you. The blood of Christ, shed for you. Amen. If you are interested in being baptized or learning more about baptism and Holy Communion please contact the pastoral staff at St. Paul. Those that would like to receive prayer, please remain at the altar.
