Anthony shared that some of the most meaningful experiences in Music Therapy have been working with clients from Kentucky State Reformatory and Down Syndrome patients.

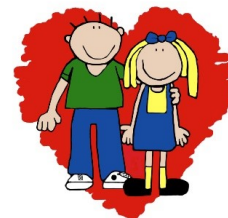

## **Missions Team**

### **Portland Promise Center**

Like many churches and organizations, the Portland Promise Center has had quite the unexpected year. The COVID-19 pandemic has forced the Center to adapt their programs and serve the community in unique ways. While it has been a challenging year, God has been on the move through the Portland Promise Center.

A staple of the Promise Center's ministry has been its community outreach during the Holiday season. Typically, holiday events center around families gathering together. While the pandemic made that difficult, the Center found unique ways to continue to love the community. For the annual Thanksgiving meal, the Promise Center served over 200 meals in a "to go" style from the front door. Through faithful donations from individuals and churches, the Center was able to provide Christmas gifts to all the students who were registered in their program prior to the COVID shutdown. They provided clothes, games, coats, shoes, headphones and more. Similarly, the Center was able to host the parent's store. The parent's store is usually a one-night event, but this year they spread out the shopping days over a week. Parents were able to shop for their families for pennies on the dollar and some at no cost. Again, because of generous donors, they were fully stocked as well as having gift cards to give to parents.

Currently, the Portland Promise Center is continuing to serve. They are in the midst of running their NTI program. They are working closely with JCPS to serve students who are in the greatest need of assistance. The Center is averaging 20 elementary aged children a day in a socially distanced environment. In the midst of the NTI program, the Center is once again offering tax assistance. Through the V.I.T.A. program, the Center is helping more individuals than ever file their taxes. They are on pace to have the largest turnout for tax assistance in their history.

Though the year has been challenging, God has provided opportunities for the Center to continue to serve. With over 60 years of experience, the Center is able to continue to meet the needs of the Portland community in a unique and needed way.
