From Pastor Derek: August Sermon Series - By Faith

When we gather for worship on a Sunday morning we gather with a multitude of saints. Hebrews 11 and 12 talk about a great cloud of witnesses that "By Faith..." have run the race and now surround us as a great cloud of witnesses as we continue to share the good news that the people called "Christian" have shared throughout the ages. We celebrate this cloud of witnesses each time we say in the Apostles Creed "the holy catholic church."

Throughout all of my ministry my dad has asked me, "Why do we say, 'the holy catholic church in the Apostles Creed." For years I've told him the answer. "Holy catholic church means 'universal church.' All of the Christians and saints that have gone before us." I thought he knew the answer. Early on in my ministry Bishop Davis visited the church that I was serving, and my dad approached the bishop and said, "Can you tell me the answer to a question my son has never been able to answer? Why do we say, 'holy catholic church' in the Apostles Creed?" I was mortified. The bishop looked at my dad and gave him the answer I'd been giving for years. My dad responded, "Wow, I've never heard that." My head could have exploded, but I think it all turned out well.

"By Faith..." The universal church has run a race that has led us to where we are today. By faith we are running our race. The songs, creeds, prayers and sermons unite us with a faithful history and push us towards a faithful future. As we journey through Hebrews 11-13 during the month of August we hope and pray that the creeds, songs, and mission of the church will become more and more alive to you just as it has for the great cloud of witnesses that have gone before us! I can't wait to hear what God does through you as you follow him by faith.

We will also be better equipped to share His love with others and make a difference in the world.

There are many resources available to help us grow in our faith and become better disciples. And of course, there is our shiny new Adult Discipleship Pastor to help find ways to intentionally dig deeper.

As the summer heat gives way to cooler temperatures and the days grow shorter, it's natural to start thinking about new beginnings. "Back to school" is a time to try new things, even if you don't have kids in school. As summer ends, there will be plenty of opportunities to take our discipleship journey to the next level. Neal Green, Director of Music Ministry

Neal Green is excited to be coming to Crestwood United Methodist Church in August as the Director of Music Ministries. Neal has been involved in church music for more than twenty years. He was inspired to pursue church music leadership by the music minister at DeHaven Memorial Baptist Church, who gave him the opportunity to play violin and french horn in the instrumental ensemble at a young age. While pursuing a Master of Church Music from Southern Seminary, he led music at First Baptist Church of Eastwood, and after graduating, was hired at Ballardsville Baptist Church in the same role, serving there from 2011 until 2022.

Outside of church settings, Neal has been a private violin/fiddle instructor and has served as orchestra conductor for multiple summer music camps. Since 2012, he has played the fiddle in the Misty Mountain String Band, a group composed of friends who met while at the seminary. The band has produced four albums and performed in several states. In 2019, Neal launched the Community Choir of Oldham County, whose debut concert featured a performance of Maurice Durufle's Requiem. Neal has been married to his wife, Layne, since 2017, and they enjoy traveling, playing gigs, and volunteering as foster parents. Neal enjoys studying history, watching movies, and following Kentucky Wildcats basketball.


