


# Take & Eat





### THE SACRAMENT OF COMMUNION

(Leader) The Lord Jesus on the night when he was betrayed took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it, and said, "Take, eat; This is my body, which is for you. Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way also he took the cup, when he had given thanks he gave it to them, saying, "This cup is the new covenant in my blood. Drink of it, all of you." For as often as you eat this bread and drink the cup, you proclaim the Lord's death until he comes. (pp. from Matthew 26:26-28 & 1 Corinthians 11:24-25)
