We now refer to them as "The Seven," a group of men who awesome statement! The choosing of deacons allowed the stepped up to serve the early church at a critical moment. Remember the story from Acts 6? As the number of believers grew, so did its needs. Unfortunately, some congregants (i.e. Hellenistic Jews) felt that their widows were being neglected in the midst of the growth. The solution? The Seven! The forerunners of deacons! These men were selected by the people to wait the tables of Grecian widows and minister to their needs. Through their service, the fellowship of the church was protected, and the ministry was furthered. Perhaps that is why my friend, Jim Futral, designated The Seven as "Problem-Solving Helpers."

I am especially grateful for those brothers I call deacons here at Temple Baptist Church. They understand that initial responsibility of the deacon-to keep the fellowship of the church through service and ministry. For the past few years, I have served with some of the most solid, selfless deacons I have ever encountered. And as we look at the next couple of weeks, we have an opportunity to nominate ten more such individuals to the Deacons Council. I ask you to pray fervently this week for guidance and discernment as you approach this decision. Read Acts 6:1-7 and 1 Timothy 3:8-13. Consider the qualities that should define a deacon. Look across the congregation for men that embody such characteristics. And finally, seek the Holy Spirit's prompting in your selection. Remember that we will take nominations through Sunday, September 26, so please turn your ballot in as soon as possible. Your vote truly matters!

Luke reminded us about the powerful results of the first deacon election: "And the word of God kept on spreading; and the number of the disciples continued to increase greatly in Jerusalem, and a great many of the priests were becoming obedient to the faith" (Acts 6:7 ESV). What an

kingdom to continue its advancement during uncertain times. Let's pray that God will use this deacon nomination also to multiply ministry and expand the Gospel's impact.

Also, I hope that you will join with us as we make a kingdom difference by supporting the Georgia Barnette State Missions Offering. The resources that come through this offering fund compassion ministries, church plants, and even disaster relief here in our own state of Louisiana. And what need we see! Thanks to your consistent giving, Baptists continue to respond to the ministry opportunities in South Louisiana even now. Feeding units, chaplains, and other assistance have been deployed. Of course, there is still much work to be done. During a time when many of our churches in South Louisiana will be limited in their giving to this offering, I pray we would step up and multiply our contributions to our state missions! To date, we have given approximately \$11,000 toward our \$30,000 goal, but I am convinced we are going to surpass our target.

"Remember this—a farmer who plants only a few seeds will get a small crop. But the one who plants generously will get a generous crop. You must each decide in your heart how much to give. And don't give reluctantly or in response to pressure. For God loves a person who gives cheerfully. And God will generously provide all you need. Then you will always have everything you need and plenty left over to share with others" (2 Corinthians 9:6-8 NLT). Paul's admonition to the Corinthian church still rings true today. As God witnesses His people giving joyfully, He not only meets their needs, but He also provides resources for them to share with others. How we at Temple can testify to that truth! The more we are able to give toward missions and ministry, the greater the blessings we see! Let's be faithful and generous! See you Sunday!

I don't believe that God is wondering what to do with this crazy mess that the world has become. I believe He's raising up teenagers that He will use to do miraculous things.
