I have a couple of updates for our summer mission trips! Please see below and prayerfully consider going on one of them.

The trip to **San Francisco** to serve our church planting partner, Realm Church, will now include a construction project. Pastor James has asked if we could help them build a patio deck for the church/ministry center. This construction project will be completed in addition to the preparation for the back-to-school outreach event. The trips dates are **July 30-August 5**, with an **approximate cost of \$800/person**.

Dates for our **New Orleans Construction Trip** have been set! We will serve our church planting partner, Immanuel Community Church, during the weekend of **August 11-15** by installing flooring in their new facility. We will depart the evening of Thursday, August 11, and return the evening of Monday, August 15. Trip **cost is approximately \$400/person**.

We still need more people to go to **Boston** with us! We will serve our church planting partner, Harbor City Church, the week of **June 18-24**.
