I hope that you could hear their excitement for making disciples in the Boston area and for extending God's kingdom in the Northeast. JAmbrose (i.e., Jacob) underscored how God has worked in their lives even in the midst of the challenges. And remember, the Ambrose story is inextricably linked to the Temple story. In fact, they **are** Temple! Temple is not defined by our programs or our buildings (although the Lord can use all those things); Temple is a people who want to see people growing in Christ, connecting in community, and engaging in mission. For some time, I have prayed that we would be known by our "sending capacity more than we are known for our seating capacity." And God continues to show us how He is sending out people from us to engage our nation and the nations with the gospel!

Please continue to pray for the Ambroses as they focus on the town of Tewksbury (in the Greater Boston area). Ask the Lord to give them favor with the people, to provide necessary relationships in the community, and to prepare local hearts for the gospel's reception. Already, you have supported the work in Boston through extraordinary ways. Last year, the Temple family gave over \$300,000 directly to support the Ambroses and the church's ministry. That initial "seed money" will be used in the days/years ahead not only to establish the church but also to fund its work. Moreover, we have committed \$25,000 to the Boston church plant through our 2024 annual budget. So, all of us have a part in the work as we contribute our tithes each month. You even support the Ambroses as you give to the Annie Armstrong Easter Offering (AAEO).

What a joy it was to host the Ambroses this past Sunday! Through your contributions to the AAEO, you allow our missionaries-including the Ambrosesto proclaim the gospel and plant new churches in strategic areas. For example, the Ambroses were able to move directly to an apartment in Boston because it had been purchased with AAEO funds. Such real estate allows planters like JAmbrose and Amanda to transition to the area where they can then discern their specific church planting location.

> Every day, I am reminded that only the gospel of Christ can transform individuals, subsequently, the culture around them. This truth motivates me to pray and give to advance the kingdom of God throughout North America. We can actively participate in restoring the gospel's place in our land by praying specifically for our Southern Baptist missionaries and by giving sacrificially to support their endeavors. To me, the AAEO is vital for the gospel advancement in our nation. Outside of the Cooperative Program, the AAEO is the primary funding stream that sustains our effort to push back the darkness in the United States and Canada. I pray that you will help us far surpass our church goal of \$87,000-not for bragging rights but for life transformation. There is nothing more significant to contribute to than God's mission.

Just this week, our college students and leaders will participate in Beach Reach at Panama City Beach. 


