The Pastor's Perspective Dr. Reggie Bridges

LORD of hosts! My soul longs, yes, even faints, for the courts of the LORD; my heart and my flesh cry out for the living God . . . Blessed are those who dwell in Your house; they will still be praising You . . . For a day in your courts is better than a thousand" (Psalm 84:1-2, 4, 10a NKJV). Hear the emotion in his declaration? The passion of his prayer? The worshipper yearned to experience God's presence within the temple; he craved the corporate exaltation of the Lord. No matter the obstacles or the barriers, his heart's intent was upon the praise of the Most High.

Often, I find myself identifying with the Psalmist's desire as I long to be in His presence with God's people. I experience joy and satisfaction in the corporate worship of Christ Jesus. I am glad when they say unto me, "Let us go into the house of the LORD" (Psalm 122:1). Now, before someone accuses me of erroneous or sloppy interpretation and theology, let me clarify what I mean.

I affirm that believers themselves actually are the temples of God (1 Corinthians 6:19). There is no longer an Old Testament temple, or physical facility, that houses the Lord's presence. During the Christ event on the cross, the veil that separated the Holy of Holies from the rest of the temple was torn from top to bottom. It was as though God's hand took hold of the top and ripped it down—conveying the reality that God's presence had been opened to us through the sacrifice of Jesus, our Mediator! At Pentecost, the Spirit descended and dwelt within believers. And He still resides in each and every child of God! Thus, we are ourselves are the "house of the Lord." We are not God! But He has dwelt within us as our Comfort, Counsel. and Strength.

The Psalmist testified, "How lovely is your tabernacle, O So, why would the Psalmist's statements apply to us? I am convinced that when the living, breathing temples of God (i.e., His children) come together, there is a greater manifestation of His presence. In other words, there is something very powerful about the church coming together in worship and service. You probably know what I am talking about. There is a special, significant element when the congregation sings together, studies together, and shares together. It doesn't negate our personal walk with the Lord; it simply amplifies the greatness and goodness of God when we join with the corporate body of Christ.

> That is just one reason I look forward to gathering back with you this Sunday. Most of you have heard that we will resume our 9 a.m. and 10:30 a.m. worship/Bible study schedule. 
3. Preparation for the Academic and Ministry Year Ahead

Over 180 years ago, Southern Baptist churches from across the U.S. came together to form an agency to help them send their own church members to take the Good News of Jesus to places around the world with no witness for Christ. Today, the organization (now known as the International Mission Board or IMB) coordinates the long-term missionary sending of over 3500 Southern Baptist missionaries who are engaging lostness on every corner of the globe. As a church, we partner with our IMB missionaries to advance the church among all the peoples of the earth through our financial support which includes our weekly offerings and special collections (Lottie Moon Christmas Offering). Another part of our role is the ongoing support we provide through prayer and personal encouragement of our Southern Baptist missionaries.

In 2008, Temple acquired a house on Mesa Street in Ruston that we refer to as the Temple Mission House. The main purpose of the house is to host Southern Baptist missionaries who are on their stateside assignment, a part of their normal rhythm when they temporarily return to the U.S. to reconnect with family, check in on health and education progress, and get Southern Baptists more involved in their work. Our maintenance of the Temple Mission House and connecting with those who stay there is an important part of our partnership with IMB missionaries and engagement in God's global mission.

In early August, we were excited to welcome the Rockett family to our Temple Mission house for a second visit. Will and Caroline, along with their children (Eleanor and Titus) serve in Cologne, Germany. They engage in a wide-ranging ministry but have a particular focus on reaching Central Asian Muslims who have moved to that region over the past half-century. You will probably see them around the church over the next year, so make sure to help them feel welcome!

Will and Caroline have graciously opened the Temple Mission House to help you get to know them and see how your resources are being invested to care for our Southern Baptist missionaries. The event is called, "Meet the Rocketts" and is a come and go event from 2-5 p.m. on September 7. Light refreshments will be provided. Can't make it?
