Thanks to some friends who heard me mention it one Wednesday night, this quote from an older Jewish teacher hangs upon the wall of my "inner" office and serves as a reminder to me in my studies. I am not digging into the Scripture in order to impress people or to further my kingdom; rather, I am encountering the Word so that I might develop an intimate relationship with the One Who spoke it—Christ Himself. My desire is to engage in a conversation with Him, and to hear His voice. I indeed love the study and the mechanics of each passage. Yes, I get excited when I find how a verb tense furthers the message of the text. I so enjoy finding how a specific word was used in the biblical world and how that term adds depth to our understanding. (You already recognized it, but I am a nerd at heart!) That is why God often confronts me in my study with a caution: "Reggie, remember! You are not studying to express your knowledge before the congregation. You are looking into My Word to communicate My knowledge to My people! It is not what you know but Who you know that truly matters!" And how right He is!

I'm so blessed to be surrounded by so many believers who longingly yearn for God's authoritative truth. I see it on Sunday mornings in our worship services and in our Sunday School classes. I witness it on Wednesday nights as you are faithful to gather again. I observe it in the small D-Groups that meet during the week. And I recognize it in personal devotions that mark our daily activities. You love the Word! Praise be to Him! But remember, you study not to make more of yourself; you study to make more of Him in yourself! We don't just try to get through Scripture; we pray that the Scripture will get through us! Indeed, we study for the "sake of our love for God"!

- 1. Pray as you enter the property.
- 2. Park at the most distant spot available.
- 3. Greet people.
- 4. Look for people to help.
- 5. Sit as close as possible to the front of the worship center. (I know this doesn't seem the "Baptist way"!)
- 6. Sit in the middle.
- 7. Sit closely.
- 8. Volunteer to serve.
- 9. Pray as you leave.

These practical tips can really foster a welcoming atmosphere and potentially lead to a genuine change in someone's life.

Let's give thanks for the privilege of being in the center of His work, and let's continue to give generously to His ministry.
