significant request that became the heart cry of revival. The on Sunday morning during our regular morning services. Todd Welsh minister, Seth Joshua, petitioned God to shape and transform his congregation, and how that prayer was answered! In particular, a young man named Evan Roberts was gripped by the words: "I felt a living power pervading my bosom . . . the tears flowed in streams . . . I cried out, 'Bend me! Bend me! Bend us!' . . . I was filled with compassion for those who must bend at judgment, and I wept . . . I felt ablaze with a desire to go through the length and breadth of Wales to tell of the Savior." The rest, they say, is history—a tremendous story of renewal and revival. Roberts formed a team that took the gospel across the nation; and through their efforts, city by city was claimed for the glory of Christ. Even after Roberts had to step back from the work, the ministry continued as thousands confessed faith and repented of their sins. It was an unmistakable move of God and His Spirit. Today, the Welsh Revival is still recognized as one of the greatest moments of renewal in the church's history.

I long to see such an outpouring of the Spirit upon our land as well. Now, don't get me wrong. I consistently and constantly witness the Lord's power in our church, our community, and beyond. He is always working! He is always changing lives! But what if we were to stop and intentionally ask Him to bend us? If we were to resurrender everything to Him and allow Him to shape us? Would we see a renewal? Could we see transformation? I'm convinced we can! Even as we approach our upcoming special services, Resurrender: Nights of Renewal, I have cried out for His overwhelming presence to be known. I have asked God to save people, change hearts, reconcile relationships, rearrange homes, revitalize believers, connect individuals to community, and so much more. In essence, I humbly pray, "Lord, bend us!"

Ultimately, we want to see long-lasting fruit from these services. Max Lucado described the outcome of the Welsh Revival: "One hundred thousand people came to Christ in less than a year. Almost-empty bars were closed for lack of business. Magistrates saw their courts emptied of criminals. Miners even had to retrain the mules that worked in the coal mines – many of the animals had been trained to respond to vulgar commands. But when the men got cleaned up, their language did as well, and the mules had to learn a new vocabulary." Retraining mules? Now that is revival! Moreover, homes were transformed, debts repaid, and social responsibility assumed as faith was lived out. You see, revival is not a worked-up excitement or emotion; it is a heart change that leads to life change. So again, pray it with me now: "Lord, bend us!" May He bend us in such a way that we will all be different people after next week! See you Sunday!






Neighbors and Nations
