
God is working, and I am so thankful to serve Him together with you. Let's make His praise glorious!

While it often seems like the world around us is growing darker, I want you to know without a doubt that there are many teenagers at our church that are boldly being the light in the darkness.

We're seeing students come to know Jesus Christ as Savior, students proclaiming their faith through baptism, and students leading their friends to faith in Jesus. I'm hearing stories of our students sharing their faith around lunch tables, and we're seeing a boldness in our students as they are taking real stands for their faith on their sports teams and in their friend groups. One way we have seen a different kind of Christ-following teenager recently was that one of our senior girls asked to join our church because she knew that just attending regularly wasn't enough – she wanted to be officially part of our church family because this is where she has found belonging, community, and a place to serve and grow. We celebrate that teenagers are coming to church; but when they want to take the extra step and be official members, it shows that there are many in this generation that aren't settling for shallow commitment to following Jesus Christ.

For the first time in several years our Youth Ministry sent out students on an international mission trip. Four of our 11th and 12th graders and three adults went to the Pacific Rim over Fall Break to serve alongside some of our missionary partners. Our students were able to meet people from drastically different cultural and religious backgrounds and boldly share the gospel through conversational evangelism. They were also able to be an encouragement to the missionaries serving and ministering to these unreached people groups in the Pacific Rim.

I'm praying that this will be the first of many trips to other countries that our students are able to take as we strive to live out the great commission and reach the nations with the gospel. Pray with me that God will continue to inspire students and even families to go to the nations with the good news of Jesus. We want to be a sending church, and this experience has added even more to our sending capability.

We have so many stories of what God is doing in and through our student ministry! Our Sunday School teachers and adult volunteers are such a huge part of how God is working. It is such an exciting time to be a part of Youth Ministry at Temple Baptist Church!
