Trinity Groups Guide – April 7, 2019

Review It

Read 1 Corinthians 2: 1-5

In the seven weeks leading to Easter, we'll be discussing various attributes of God who became man and dwelt among us in the person of Jesus Christ. Like the Apostle Paul, we'll resolve to know nothing but Jesus—both who He is and what He did for us on the cross, for all eternity.

Talk About It

1. Read John 2:13. This is the first miracle Jesus ever performed. The setting of this situation is significant. They were in a situation where the expectations were high, but the joy was low. Describe an experience that you have had similar to this. You had very high hopes of what was to come, but your joy wasn't there. How did you get through that situation?
2. Sometimes we tend to focus on the natural problem instead of the spiritual solution. In moments like these we need to remember to "live by faith and not by sight." What are some practical steps we can take in our everyday lives to put this scripture into use?
3. Read Isaiah 30:15 & 2 Corinthians 1:20. When we are waiting on answers or a certain outcome, we tend to take matters into our own hands and/or exaggerate the negative. Have you done one or both of these things? What was the outcome?
4. Read John 2:6. Jesus didn't just perform the miracle, but He taught a lesson as well. Oftentimes in the middle of our miracle there are lessons to be learned. Name one of the most significant lessons the Lord has ever taught you.
5. Through our lessons and miracles, Jesus wants us to expect the best. The answers we receive may not be what we were hoping for, but we know that the Lord is always on our side. During these seasons is it easy for you to remember this promise? Have you been able to see the Lord working on your behalf? How has that encouraged you in your day-to-day life?

Think About It

Take some time to pray through the areas of doubt you have in your mind and ask the Lord to be the miracle worker. Allow Him the opportunity to answer your questions, complete your miracles, and keep your expectation and joy level high.

Act On It & Pray About It

Read Mark 10:27. Jesus challenges us to believe the unbelievable. This week begin thinking about the things you are believing God for. The more impossible they sound, the more the Lord can do. Next to each prayer request, write out a scripture of encouragement. As you pray over these requests, also read aloud the scripture to help remind yourself that nothing is impossible for God!
