Discussion Questions:

- **REVIEW IT**

Pastor Jared taught the history and meaning of Passover, to show that Jesus is the Lamb of God. Jesus fulfilled the meaning of Passover by giving His life so that death would pass over us. There are three things unique about the lamb from the instructions found for the first Passover in the book of Exodus. These unique requirements are also true for the Lamb of God. As Easter approaches, let's remember that Jesus is our Passover Lamb!

- **DISCUSS IT**

1. Discuss the connections made between the first lamb of Passover and Jesus as our Passover Lamb. How did this impact your understanding of Passover?

2. Pastor Jared mentioned that Jesus' death happened at a point in history where capital punishment was the worst it's ever been- crucifixion on a cross. How does it make you feel to hear what Jesus endured on your behalf?
3. As a group, read Isaiah 53:5 (NIV). Discuss ways you may need healing, peace, or freedom, and how this week's message can give you the confidence and belief to move forward with what Jesus has already done for you.

- **RESPOND TO IT**

"Jesus, thank You for being our Passover Lamb. Help us to see where we need healing and freedom in Your Name and by Your blood. We surrender these areas and our lives to You. You are all we will ever need to live a victorious life. Lead us to those who have never tasted of Your goodness and give us a heart to always welcome them to our tables. We love You, and it's in Your name we pray. Amen!"
