Icebreaker Questions

- Who in your family most influenced your faith or values?
- What's a family tradition that means a lot to you?
- Who taught you something that still shapes you today?

Sermon Summary

This week's sermon emphasized that God designed faith to be passed down through families, beginning at home as our first ministry field. Using Aaron's family as an example, the sermon contrasts the faithfulness of Moses, Aaron, Eleazar, and Ithamar with the rebellion of Nadab and Abihu, who disobeyed God and forfeited their legacy. It reminds believers that what parents build in faith today shapes how the next generation follows Jesus. Even when family history includes failure or brokenness, God offers redemption and the chance to begin a new, godly legacy. Ultimately, each person must decide, like Joshua, "As for me and my house, we will serve the Lord."

Opening Prayer

Briefly pray and invite the Lord into your conversations to bring wisdom and insight to His Word. Pray around the theme for the sermon/discussion.

Primary Passage of Scripture

Read Numbers 3:1–4, Deuteronomy 6:6–7, Proverbs 20:7, Joshua 24:15

Discussion Questions

- How do you see faith traditions passed down in your own family?
- What are some habits that can make faith a daily priority in your household?
- What might it look like to carry on a spiritual legacy when others before you failed?
- How does integrity in parents bless their children, as Proverbs 20:7 teaches?
- What legacy are you building for your children or those who follow you?
- How can Jesus' example as our faithful high priest guide our leadership at home?
- What does approaching "the throne of grace with confidence" look like in family life for you?

Prayer

- Ask: "How can we pray for you this week?"
- Assign each request to a group member to ensure everyone is prayed for during the prayer time.
- Assign someone to open in prayer and someone to close in prayer.
