## Registration Information and Timeline

### February 19, 2021

- You can begin to register your group for Zona Camp 2021! All experiences except Zona Experience have limited availability. Space is determined on a first come first serve basis and early registration is encouraged.

### March 19, 2021

- Zona Policy Agreement Form and Basic Registration Form is due.
- Deposit of \$100 per person is due to make a reservation for camp.  
(CAMP SPOTS WILL NOT BE GUARANTEED UNTIL THE ABOVE FORMS ARE SUBMITTED WITH DEPOSIT.)

### April 19, 2021

- The balance of \$249 per person is due for those whose deposits have been paid
- The following forms are due at this time:
  - Detailed Registration Form (*Names, Grades, Genders, and Experience Choices*)
  - Leader Volunteer Form
  - Missions Life Form (if applicable)

### May 1<sup>st</sup> to May 15<sup>th</sup>

- During this time, we will work with each church to assign housing. You will be sent a blank housing form, and you will have the opportunity to place your group into rooms/beds. Simply return the form to us to complete housing assignments. **May 21, 2021**- Deadline for leaders to complete the provided online Child Abuse Awareness training.

### Upon Arrival at Camp (June 1, 2021) Please have these forms separated into three stacks at Registration.

- Health Form for every person in your group (2 Pages)
- Authorization and Release Agreement for every person in your group (1 Page)  
(*All students' medications will be handled by the church leaders.*)
- Glorieta Release should be completed digitally before arrival at camp.
- Parent COVID Waiver

## General Information about Zona Camp

## **Total Cost**

Total camp cost is \$349 per person (students and leaders).

## **Length of Camp**

Camp begins at 2pm on Tuesday and concludes with breakfast Saturday. Registration will begin at 2:00pm on Tuesday.

## **Age Requirement of Campers**

Entering seventh grade fall of 2021 (completed 6<sup>th</sup> grade) through newly graduated seniors in high school.

## **Leaders**

Leaders must be at least 21 years of age. The church must bring at least one leader per eight students. The church is responsible for selecting responsible and spiritually mature leaders. Leaders will be responsible for leading small groups, nightly church devotions, participating in recreation and worship activities, assisting their youth in matters of discipline, dress, first aid, curfew, and spiritual matters. Leaders must pass a background check through the AZSBC every year. Each Leader must also complete an online Child Abuse Awareness training, provided by Glorieta Camps to be completed by May 21, 2021 (must be completed every other year). Details for these requirements are included in the Zona Leader Volunteer Form to be filled out by all Leaders. Any leader who will be driving students for Mission Life are to maintain a clean driving record which will be verified by the AZSBC.

## **Health Form, and Release Form, and Glorieta Digital Release \*\*\*2021 COVID Waiver\*\*\***

***\* Updates have been made to these forms, please ensure your group uses the 2021 version***

Each student and leader must fill out all three forms. It is MANDATORY that these forms are brought to camp at check-in and highly recommended that a copy of the Health Form be kept by the church in case of emergency. No student or leader will be permitted to stay at camp without completed Health, Release, and Waiver forms. **Please have them separated into three separate stacks at Registration.**

## **Insurance, First Aid, and Health Office**

Churches are to provide proof of insurance listing the Arizona Southern Baptist Convention as additional insured. Each church is to bring a first aid kit including items specified on page 3 and handle any non-emergency health issues within their group including but not limited to bandages, over the counter medications, etc. For 2021, the Zona medical team will only deal with first aid, all illness will be handled by the church according to the COVID Policy. In the case of emergency where 9-1-1 needs to be called, please contact Glorieta Camps (number provided on your name badge) who will place that call and direct emergency services to the correct location.

## **Students with Special Needs**

Zona Camp is not equipped to provide one on one care for campers. If you have a student with special needs, the family and the church need to work together to determine if the camper's needs can be adequately met at Zona Camp. For dietary needs, in 2021, students and leaders may bring any additional foods to store in the assigned allergy refrigerator in the Glorieta cafeteria, microwaves and toasters will be available for use. No provided meals will contain nuts and a gluten free option will be available for an additional \$3 per meal if requested 2 weeks in advance. All meals will be served family style.

## **Rooming Assignments**

When rooming assignments are made, it is the goal of Zona Camp that no leader be placed in the same room as a student. Due to the varied housing accommodations provided by Glorieta Camp this may not be possible. Each church should work directly with the camp director and administrator for any exceptions. Zona Camp has an open-door policy, no leader should ever be alone with a student.

## **Glorieta is an unlocked campus**

Please stress to your campers that items that hold significant value should be left at home.

Churches may wish to set a clear code of conduct regarding the protection of personal belongings within their group.

Churches may also wish to provide a locked vehicle for specific personal items for their group during the day.

Zona Camp is not liable for any stolen or lost items and will not be involved in the investigation or discipline surrounding any stolen or lost items.

## **Experience Choices**

Zona Camp has four Experiences for students to choose from. Experience schedule will be from after Morning Celebration until mid-afternoon. Below are the Experiences to choose from.

- **Impact** is for students who are ready for the next level in discipleship with a focus on worldview. (Must be in High School for this Experience Choice). There are three groups within Impact. Impact 1.0 for newcomers, Impact 2.0 for those who have completed 1.0, and Impact 3.0 for those who have completed 2.0. This experience joins the Zona Experience after lunch.
- **Worship Catalyst Experience** meets the unique needs of musicians, singers, actors, and technologists helping them become great worship leaders. Students must already know how to play their instrument, and guitar players (acoustic, electric, and bass) must bring their instruments with them (we provide drums). This experience returns to their experience classes after lunch. Participation is by audition, please see the website for instructions.
  - ***WCE may not be available for the summer of 2021. Updates will be provided when available.***
- **Zona Experience** is a high energy opportunity where students will enjoy small group bible studies mixed with a wide variety of classes and activities that they choose.
- **Mission Life** is an on and off-campus mission experience for those students looking for a hands-on experience to serve others. An adult leader with sufficient transportation (proof of vehicle insurance required) and a Mission Life form required if anyone in your group chooses this Experience. Drivers for Mission Life are to maintain a clean driving record which will be verified by the AZSBC.

## **General Guidelines**

### **Camp Dress**

Since this is a Christian youth camp, we ask all campers/leaders to dress with this in mind. Church leaders are responsible for enforcing dress requirements.

### **The following is recommended:**

- Undergarments are not displayed.
- Shorts, skirts, and dresses are at a length that will allow the wearer's finger tips to touch the garment when arms and hands are fully extended, while standing.
- All forms of clothing cover the wearer's midriff and, for females, the chest/bust area as well. The length of garments worn on the upper torso (i.e. shirts, tanks, blouses, sweaters) must cover or be covered by the wearer's waist band while standing.
- No tube tops or spaghetti straps are allowed.
- T-Shirts must be worn over swimsuits.
- Tank tops may be worn but straps must be two inches wide or wider
- All forms of clothing cover or rest on or above a wearer's hips.
- Bare feet are prohibited.
- Lewd clothing and clothing which displays alcohol, tobacco products, satanic symbols, and inappropriate language and/or symbols, is not permitted.

### **Other Policy**

No Skate boards, long boards, or scooters are permitted at Glorieta Camps.

### **Camp Discipline**

#### **Concerning any discipline problem:**

- The first level of resolution will be between the camper and his/her leader.
- If the problem is not resolved between camper and leader, the Camp Director will meet with all parties involved.
- If the problem cannot be resolved, it could result in the camper being sent home early at the church's expense.
- Any illegal activity will be handled by the police department.

#### **No Tolerance Issues that are immediately handled by the Camp Director:**

- Knives, firearms, ammunition, or other weapons (air soft guns or any simulation of a firearm)
- Controlled substances, alcohol, or tobacco including vaping
- Sexual misconduct/harassment/abuse

#### **What will get you sent home**

- Undesirable literature
- Food fights, or any other form of fighting
- Fireworks, explosives and/or highly flammable materials
- Pets
- Profanity, abusive or inconsiderate language
- Excessive noise
- Gambling
- Water balloons or shaving cream (except for the purpose of shaving)
- Use of candles, matches, or any type of open flame within buildings
- Bullying
- Irresponsible use of Social Media

### **Don't Forget to Pack...**

- Health Form, Release form, 2021 COVID Release form
- Masks for 5 days, taking into consideration needing a new mask after participating in Rec activities.
- Bible, notebook, pencil
- **Sleeping bag or bed roll and pillow**
- Towels, washcloth, etc.
- Toiletries: soap, shampoo, toothbrush, etc.
- Clothes for 5 days – keeping in mind there will be time for worship, games, sports, etc.
- Close-toed shoes and work clothes for Mission Track

- Closed-toed shoes, we're in the mountains!!
- Sunscreen! Higher altitude means you'll burn quickly.
- Extra spending money for snacks
- COOPERATIVE SPIRIT AND ENTHUSIASM

Zona Camp working in accordance with Glorieta Adventure Camps will enforce the following COVID Policies:

### **Masks**

- Masks must be worn properly (over the nose and mouth) at all times during camp, the only exception is while eating. All students and leaders will need to bring enough masks to compensate for broken or soiled masks due to recreation and other daily activities. Zona Camp recommends 2 masks per day.
- Churches should bring additional masks to ensure that all students and leaders are never without a mask, Zona camp will not provide masks.

### **Health Checks**

- Churches are responsible for verifying that all students, leaders, as well as the persons they reside with are without COVID symptoms prior to getting on the bus.
- While at camp, leaders are responsible for monitoring the health of the students in their care. If any COVID symptoms (According to the CDC list on the Zona website) are present, leaders will work with the Zona Camp office to isolate the student from the rest of the group.

### **Symptoms/Isolation/Removal**

- It is the responsibility of the church, working with the parents or guardians, to remove the student from the Glorieta campus within 24 hours of symptom onset and isolation. No refunds will be given.
- The Zona medical staff will be available in person for first aid assistance only. Telephone consultation with Zona medical staff will be available to help determine need for isolation, or Urgent Care for ill students.
- Churches will be responsible for transporting ill students to Urgent Care centers in Santa Fe.
- Churches will be responsible for making sure students are hydrated and well rested as altitude sickness will also be prevalent at Glorieta and the symptoms are similar to COVID symptoms. Arriving at Glorieta fully hydrated and well rested will be important to ensuring your student is not misdiagnosed.

# Symptoms of Coronavirus (COVID-19)

Know the symptoms of COVID-19, which can include the following:



Symptoms can range from mild to severe illness, and appear 2–14 days after you are exposed to the virus that causes COVID-19.

## Seek medical care immediately if someone has Emergency Warning Signs of COVID-19

- Trouble breathing
- Persistent pain or pressure in the chest
- New confusion
- Inability to wake or stay awake
- Bluish lips or face
