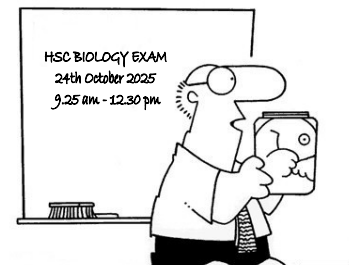
The purpose of this News Update is to help you to pray in an informed way for our year 12 brothers and sisters, many from Jannali Anglican Church, who are undertaking their Higher
