This week's sermon text:
Luke 24: 13-35

When my son came to me, he was six months old. He had a completely different name. A different identity, if you will. His given name was, let's say, different; and so the case workers encouraged me to come up with a nickname for him. Which I did, something kind of close to his given name so it wouldn't confuse him too much. I chose to call him Sully, after the pilot Sully Sullenberger, or so I thought.

He came to me on a Wednesday, so I of course had him with me at church that evening. All of the kids were excited and asked what the baby's name was. When I told them I was calling him Sully they all got excited and said..."like from Monsters Inc." If you have ever seen that Disney movie, then you know what they are referencing. From that point on, Sully just stuck as his nick name.

Over those first two years, we acquired MANY Sully the monster toys.

As adoption became real, the caseworkers and my lawyer encouraged me to change his name completely. Which I struggled with, but did so for his safety. When I say his whole identity changed, it did, at least legally. I was worried how he would adjust to a new name at the age of two. For the first month or two he would tell everyone, "my name is Sully." Then he got used to it. We got used to it and lived into his new name. Two years later, he never even mentions the name Sully. He lived into his new name, his new life.

The same is true for us as followers of Christ. The world calls us so many names: unloved, not worthy, outcast, and so so many more. Yet, God calls us by new name: beloved. We are beloved children of God and we are invited to live into this new identity, this new truth, we receive through him who first loved us. My prayer is that the more we live into these new names, these new truths, the less we respond to those names and words the world calls us.

As we journey through this season of Easter, may we truly lie as people of the Resurrection. May we live as God's beloved sharing light, love, mercy, grace, and compassion to all we meet. After all, that is how we are called to live as the beloved community. This is my prayer for all of us. You are loved. You are welcomed. You are forgiven.


