SOLID Youth Program "40 Off" – Jump On Program / Mission Trip Incentive

The "40 Off" program has two primary goals:

Empowerment – Encourage youth to take greater responsibility for their Mission Trips and Young Christians Weekend.

Affordability – Help reduce the cost of these events for each participant.

Event Costs

Young Christians Weekend: \$200 Mission Trip: \$500

How the Program Works

For every hour a youth participates in approved work activities outside of regular Sunday and Wednesday services, \$10 will be deducted from the total cost of their trip.

Example:

If a youth works 16 hours, they will earn \$160 toward their Mission Trip, reducing the cost from \$500 to \$340.

Youth can earn up to \$200 off each trip through this program.
With the full \$200 earned, the Mission Trip cost drops to \$300.
This is a great opportunity for youth to grow, serve, and invest in their own spiritual journeys while helping ease the financial burden on families.



Children's Ministry Right Now Media Pick of the Month


This month's Kids Pick of the Month is:
