Our vision team presented the new vision for 2026-2028 in both worship services Sunday. The team did a wonderful job of capturing what the Lord put on their hearts. We spent 7 months reading scripture, praying, reading what church leaders say, brushing up on this congregation's history, learning about our denomination and studying the demographics of our town. With all of this research, we met once per month to hear and compare notes. For many members of the team, the meetings felt like a little slice of what they needed from the church. As they met and worked together, they discovered that they were growing in their relationship with God and making new friends. They were developing relationships and being developed as leaders themselves. They were gaining insight as to what the Lord wants from the church and how we can uniquely express faith in our community.

If you did not catch the presentation, the theme of our new vision is "GO." The team felt captivated and called to respond to the great commission of Jesus found in Matthew's gospel chapter 28:19-20. Jesus calls us to "Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit." A part of this vision is the calling to develop leaders who are not only growing spiritually, but also learning to become disciple makers themselves. Likewise, the vision team challenges us to embrace the numerical growth that we are experiencing and commit to getting our new members engaged into the life of the church. As part of that process, you will start hearing new phrases like "assimilation, landing spots, pathways, etc." The membership team, hospitality and adult spiritual growth teams will be invited to carry heavier loads over the next three years. We have continued to feel called to remain part of the denomination, to express the open table fellowship and maintain a spirit of "where our differences don't divide us." One of the strengths of our church has always been reaching out to those in need, and we intend to keep that a priority as well. We are being challenged to take our online ministry to the next level by offering even more ministry online. One unique challenge is the invitation to consider some sort of partnership with another church family in a surrounding town.

The spirit of the vision is an emphatic charge, it feels like a calling to "go for it." Embracing growth will call us all to adjust, and to let go of some control and look beyond the ways we've always done things. And while that is scary, it is also very exciting! I hope you were as moved as I was by the solid presentation in worship and that you are ready for the next three years of spirit led, fruitful ministry in the name of our Lord Jesus.




Our youth will also be heading to Colorado this year to serve that community as well as to deepen their connection to the Lord and one another. For information on this trip check out our youth group.


Coming in March:


