DIPNET TRIP

JULY 17 - 19



Come join the King's family for an unforgettable time of fellowship, fishing, and fun at the Kasilof River! Whether you're a seasoned dipnetter or brand new, this trip is a great way to connect, catch fish, and make lasting memories.

LOCATION AND OVERVIEW

We'll be camping near the mouth of the **Kasilof River** — not at the state campground.

Please refer to the map on the next page for directions!

Important Reminders:

- Each family is responsible for their own gear, food, and fishing equipment.
- You must have an **Alaska Sport Fishing License** and a **Personal Use Fishing Permit**. Get them at: www.adfg.alaska.gov or scan the QR Code
- Camping is primitive. There are porta potties in the parking lot only (not near the river).
- Nearest town for supplies: Soldotna (30 mins away)
- Drive time from Wasilla: approx. 4 hrs 15 mins



DIRECTIONS

- From Anchorage, take the New Seward Hwy
- After 90 miles, take the Sterling Hwy toward Soldotna
- Cross the Kasilof River bridge
- Turn right on Cohoe Loop Road, follow it past the pavement onto the dirt road
- Park when you see the ocean in front of you
- If you have 4x4, turn right at the parking lot onto the sand road — follow it to the river mouth where the King's crew will be camped!



SCHEDULE

- People will be coming and going throughout the week.
- King's Worship Night – Thursday, July 17 at 6:30 pm (near the Bracken Camp)
- Most families leave by Saturday noon

BE AWARE

- Only 4x4 vehicles should drive past the parking lot (deep sand).
- There's a lot of ATV traffic — keep kids close!
- The river is **not safe for swimming** (seals, sharks, and boats present).
- Avoid walking on the mudflats during low tide — it's dangerous!
- There are no restrooms near the river. The closest option is the porta-potties located at the main parking lot, which is a walk or drive from the riverbank. Plan accordingly!

WHAT TO BRING

Here's a helpful packing list so you don't forget a thing!

Dipnet Gear

- Fishing license & dipnet permit
- Dipnet
- Gloves, waders, and a fish bat
- Buckets & coolers (with lots of ice)
- Filet knives & sharpener
- Scissors (to clip tails)
- Trash bags (for fish & garbage)
- Clorox wipes & hand sanitizer

Camping Essentials

- Tent or shelter
- Sleeping bags & blankets
- Cot or pad
- Camp chairs
- Flashlight & extra batteries
- Tarp
- First aid kit
- Water (for 3–4 days)
- Cooking gear (stove, propane, charcoal, pots/pans)
- Paper plates, bowls, cups, utensils, napkins, paper towels
- Matches or lighter fluid

Clothing

- Warm layers (sweatshirts, jackets, long sleeves)
- Rain gear & rain boots
- Extra socks & underwear
- Pajamas
- Sunglasses, hat, sunscreen, bug spray
- Flip flops or camp shoes

Family Extras

- Toys for the kids
- Toiletries & towels
- Toilet paper (bring your own!)
- Hand soap
