Your vision team has been diligently working on updating our bylaws. Over the past two years with the efforts of the Board and the congregation, we've tweaked, edited, and molded the scaffolding of our church to match the ministry that is just bursting from our congregation.

Now, we're entering the final phase of our vision plan. With one final year of our Vision Goal, we have new members stepping into leadership roles, a growing congregation, and the final supportive steps. These steps include:

- 1. Editing and drafting of our Policies and Procedures. Members of our Vision Team and Personnel will work with our ministry teams and staff to outline the behind-the-scenes and inner workings of our ministry. This final piece will help newer leaders better understand their ministry areas and make our ministry more transparent for the whole congregation.
- 2. A Leadership and Board Retreat Sunday, June 25. Following worship, all our ministry teams and board leadership will gather to learn more about their areas of ministry and collaborate in a shared vision of ministry for the upcoming year.

Property Committee...

Warmer weather will be coming and with that we have activity going on with our property. Here's just some of the things that have been on my mind that need work on, help with or just making the congregation aware of.

- 1. We have been replacing several of our glass windows that are cracked with plexiglass that is already cut to fit. These are located in the educational wing which houses our preschool area and offices. When the wind is blowing in the right direction, the cold air that comes in through these cracks is quite noticeable. I wanted to make the congregation aware of this in case they happen to notice.
- 2. We could really use someone (or a group of someone's) to maintain the flower beds outside with keeping the weeds pulled and looking good.
- 3. Our Preschool is looking for a storage shed for their outside play toys. A 4'by 8' or so would work.
- 4. Many of our downspouts need some repairs if anyone could help with that.
- 5. It's been mentioned to me that the memorial tree that's located in the Narthex has not been updated in the past years. Is there someone (or a ministry team) that would want to get this updated? The tree branches are getting very full and we might need to brainstorm for some ideas on how to expand this.
- 6. As I mentioned in the service Sunday when our little ones were looking outside the windows, fingerprints and just dirt that has accumulated from the winter months needs to be washed from our windows. We have the equipment to use, but need hands to help get this done! Last year we hired a window cleaning service thanks to a few congregational members who offered to foot the bill for this. If that is something folks are interested in again, make Kris aware.
- 7. Our mailbox post is getting pretty run down and it's broken. We need to get a new post for that.
- 8. I'll be having the very small stained glass ceiling panels in the hallway outside of the offices eliminated as they are leaking from the elements outside rain, snow, cold.
- 9. I've noticed lately that our current upright vacuum cleaner could really be replaced. It's old and tired!!! Prefer an Advance VU500-15 inch Model 107404754 as we have many dust bags stocked up already for this type. The last one we purchased came from CAP SAN located at 2137 Sunset Rd.
- 10. FYI I recently had a conversation with our new neighbor to the North along Fleur. They are interested in buying 20 30 feet of our North lot so that they can widen their lot. Is this something that our congregational members would want to consider? Let the office, your Board chair or me know of any strong feelings one way or the other.

Thanks to Taylor for his help with spreading the mulch in front of the building.


