How God Speaks Through His Word

PLAY TELEPHONE. First person whispers a phrase (no repeats allowed) to person on their right, that person then whispers what they heard to the next, repeat process until it gets back to the starter, then compare the two phrases. Note: the less people involved, the more complicated the phrase can be. A twist on this game is Paper Telephone or Telestrations (google or youtube for how to play).

SHARE about a time where God used His Word to speak clearly to you.

HIS WORD GUIDES.

READ Ephesians 4:11-16 together.

- What don't you like about these verses?
- What do these verses tell us about the nature of man?
- What do they reveal about what God is like?
- What do you need to do about these truths this week?

DISCUSS | Do you find it difficult to hear from God? Why or why not?

How can it be difficult to determine if it's God's voice you are hearing?
How can you know?

How can other voices keep us from hearing clearly from God?

HIS WORD ENCOURAGES.

What voices do YOU need to learn to tune out or quiet so that you can tune in to God's voice?

Make a list of sources of false or half truths in your life that create noise that can mask the Truth that God is wanting you to hear. (ex: youtube vids, fortnite, tv, etc...)
