## WAYS TO USE THIS CUE

## BABY OR NAH? | WK4

### THE TEXT | Ephesians 4:11-16

**PLAY | AIR SOCCER** | Using a table, or section of floor, make a miniature soccer field with goals (be creative, use what you have available). Then, give everyone a straw and divide into teams. Using a ping pong ball, play some Air Hockey. Using only air blown through the straws to move the ball - no hands. Spread players around the edges of the 'field' to work together. **LEAD IN:** *In our passage today, we find out, that just like this ball, if we don't work together, we can end up being blown around. Let's check it out.*

### SHARE |

- Who's the strongest person you've ever met?  
Physically? Spiritually?
- What is one 'childish' thing you still like to do?

### DISCUSS | Read Ephesians 4:11-16

- What stands out to you?
- What does it reveal about God?
- What does this tell us about our nature?
- What do you like/dislike about this verse?
- What do you need to do about this truth this week?

*Use the above questions to discuss any of today's Scriptures.*

### PRAY |

Pray Ephesians 4:11-16 back to God.
