AT THE TABLE

PLAY TOGETHER



KILLER | Give everyone a playing card, (with only one ACE in circulation). Whoever has the ACE is the killer. The killer takes players out by winking at them. Players that are winked at are out. To win, two "living" players must both accuse the killer to expose him. Wrong accusations result in the death of the accusers.

BIBLE DISCOVERY METHOD |

Read Hebrews 2:11-13 & discuss:

1. What stands out to you?
2. What does this tell us about our nature?
3. What does this tell us about God's character?
4. What do you like/dislike about this passage?
5. What do you need to do in response to this?

PARENT CHECK |

Sometimes parenting can be a delicate balance of being both the advocate and the accuser of our children. The goal, of course, is never to accuse to condemn, but to discover the truth to encourage them to walk in the truth. As a parent, how can you be an advocate in a world that wants to accuse your teen at every corner?
