Ten Commandments and the Two Greatest Commandments

Exodus 20:1-20 & Deuteronomy 5:1-22; 6:5-8; Leviticus 19:1-4, 11-12, 16-18 → Matthew 5:17-20; 22:35-40; John 15:12-14; Romans 3:20, 7:6-7, 12, 14; 8:6-8; Galatians 3:21, 23-25.

The first commandment – You shall have no other gods before me. Ex. 20:1-3 and Deut. 5:6-7; God’s name: Exodus 34:14; Duet. 4:23-24

A related story: Numbers 22:1-39 Balak summons Balaam; Numbers 24:10-14 Balaam frustrates Balak; Joshua 24:10 God’s protection; Joshua 13:22 Balaam’s trade; Balaam’s problem 2 Peter 2:15-16 and Jude 11

No public curses but devastating advice Numbers 25:1-17; Revelation 2:14

God’s vengeance on the Midianites Numbers 31:1-18; Deuteronomy 23:3-6 and Nehemiah 13:1, 2

Divination: *the art or practice that seeks to foresee or foretell future events or discover hidden knowledge usually by the interpretation of omens or by the aid of supernatural powers.*

The second commandment – You shall not make for yourself an idol. Ex. 20:4-6 and Deut. 5:7-10; Duet. 4:23-24

The third commandment – Misusing the Lord’s name. Ex. 20:7 and Deut. 5:11

The fourth commandment – The Sabbath Ex. 20:8-10 and Deut. 5:12-15

The fifth commandment – Honoring dad and mom. Ex. 20:12 and Deut. 5:16

The sixth commandment – You shall not commit murder. Ex. 20:13 and Deut. 5:17; Matthew 5:21-26

The seventh commandment – You shall not commit adultery. Ex. 20:14 and Deut. 5:18; Matthew 5:27-32

The eighth commandment – You shall not steal. Ex. 20:15 and Deut. 5:19

The ninth commandment – You shall not give false testimony against your neighbor. Ex. 20:16 and Deut. 5:20

The tenth commandment – You shall not cover your neighbor’s wife and property. Ex. 20:17 and Deut. 5:21

Demanding a king 1 Samuel 8:1-22; 10:17-25; 12:1-4, 12-20; Hosea 13:9-11 **Rules for one:** Deuteronomy 17:8-13

The northern Kingdom Israel had 19 kings all were wicked. Judah, the southern kingdom (two tribes Judah and Benjamin) had 21 kings and 1 queen, only 9 or 10 so were good kings.

Exodus 19:1-8 **The great plans God had for Israel, and the condition of that promise.**

Why did God say to Moses on Mount Sinai, this time? What had God said to Moses before at this place (Exodus 3:1-12)? What else happened at this location (Exodus 4:27-28)? Jesus the great high priest Hebrews 4:14-15
