



God's Important Messages about Generosity:



- 2 Samuel 22:28: You save the humble, but your eyes are on the haughty to bring them low.
- Job 8:7: Your beginnings will seem humble, so prosperous will your future be.

THREE VERY IMPORTANT NEW TESTAMENT SCRIPTURES ON THIS SUBJECT:

- **Philippians 2:8:** And being found in appearance as a man, he **humbled** himself by becoming obedient to death— even death on a cross!
- James 4:6: But he gives us more grace. That is why Scripture says: "God opposes the proud but shows favor to the humble."
- James 1:9: Believers in humble circumstances ought to take pride in their high position.



God's Important Messages about Humility:


Humility is actually a strength in God's eyes, whereas pride is a weakness. We should learn that when we feel humble, we are actually closest to his strength. When we feel like we have less than others, we actually have more in his eyes.

- **Proverbs 22:21:** teaching you to be honest and to speak the truth, so that you bring back **truthful** reports to those you serve?

THREE VERY IMPORTANT NEW TESTAMENT SCRIPTURES ON THIS SUBJECT:

- John 8:32: Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free.
- John 1:17: For the law was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ.
- John 14:6: Jesus answered, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me.



God's Important Messages about Truthfuliness/Honesty:

We should believe in Jesus, not because it feels good or because we've been taught a tradition. The strongest believers are those who have come to believe that the death and resurrection of Jesus are true. Telling the truth is important because anything that is founded on a lie or includes a lie will topple under pressure.





BIBLE STORIES SHOWING TRUTHFULLNESS/HONESTY:

- The conversion of Zacchaeus the Tax Collector (Luke 19:1-10)
- The story of Ananias and Sapphira (A married couple sold their land and gave the proceeds to the disciples only they didn't give all of the money. They lied...they died.) (Acts 5:1-11)

Last time the subject appears in the Bible:

1 Peter 3:8: Finally, all of you, be like-minded, be sympathetic, love one another, be **compassionate** and humble.

THREE VERY IMPORTANT OLD TESTAMENT SCRIPTURES ON THIS SUBJECT:

- Lamentations 3:22: Because of the Lord's great love we are not consumed, for his compassions never fail.
- Exodus 34:6: And he passed in front of Moses, proclaiming, "The Lord, the Lord, the compassionate and gracious God, slow to anger, abounding in love and faithfulness,
- **Psalm 86:15:** But you, Lord, are a **compassionate** and gracious God, slow to anger, abounding in love and faithfulness.

THREE VERY IMPORTANT NEW TESTAMENT SCRIPTURES ON THIS SUBJECT:

- Matthew 14:14: When Jesus landed and saw a large crowd, he had compassion on them and
- healed their sick.
- **Ephesians 4:32:** Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you.

Colossians 3:12: Therefore, as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with **compassion**, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience.



God's Important Messages about Compassion/Empathy:

To have compassion or empathy means to put yourself in another person's shoes. Children can do this well by playing make-pretend games and asking them how different things feel. Compassion and empathy go hand-in-hand with the Golden Rule.

First time the subject appears in the Bible:

Exodus 23:2: "Do not follow the crowd in doing wrong. When you give testimony in a lawsuit, do not pervert **justice** by siding with the crowd,

LAST

Last time the subject appears in the Bible:

Revelation 19:11: I saw heaven standing open and there before me was a white horse, whose rider is called Faithful and True. With **justice** he judges and wages war

THREE VERY IMPORTANT OLD TESTAMENT SCRIPTURES ON THIS SUBJECT:

- Leviticus 19:15: "Do not pervert justice; do not show partiality to the poor or favoritism to the great, but judge your neighbor fairly.
- Proverbs 2:9: Then you will understand what is right and just and fair—every good path.
- *Isaiah 1:17:* Learn to do right; seek **justice**. Defend the oppressed. Take up the cause of the fatherless; plead the case of the widow.

THREE VERY IMPORTANT NEW TESTAMENT SCRIPTURES ON THIS SUBJECT:

- Matthew 23:23: "Woe to you, teachers of the law and Pharisees, you hypocrites! You give a
 tenth of your spices—mint, dill and cumin. But you have neglected the more important
 matters of the law—justice, mercy and faithfulness. You should have practiced the latter,
 without neglecting the former.
- Luke 18:7: And will not God bring about justice for his chosen ones, who cry out to him day and night? Will he keep putting them off?
- **John 7:51:** "Does our law condemn a man without first hearing him to find out what he has been doing?"



God's Important Messages about Fairness/Justice:

The most important behaviors that impede justice among children have to do with them observing the outer person rather than looking for the inner one. They may show favoritism to people with a certain appearance or set of belongings. God wants them to look with their hearts.





BIBLE STORIES SHOWING FAIRNESS/JUSTICE:

- The Story of Esther, where the evil Haman was hung on the killing device he set up for the Jews (Esther 7)
- Parable of the Workers (Matthew 20:1-16)

Genesis 34:21: "These men are **friendly** toward us," they said. "Let them live in our land and trade in it; the land has plenty of room for them. We can marry their daughters and they can marry ours."

LAST

Last time the subject appears in the Bible:

James 4:4: You adulterous people, don't you know that **friend**ship with the world means enmity against God? Therefore, anyone who chooses to be a **friend** of the world becomes an enemy of God.

THREE VERY IMPORTANT OLD TESTAMENT SCRIPTURES ON THIS SUBJECT:

- Proverbs 11:13: A gossip betrays a confidence, but a trustworthy person keeps a secret.
- Proverbs 17:17: A friend loves at all times, and a brother is born for a time of adversity.
- Proverbs 27:17: As iron sharpens iron, so one person sharpens another.

THREE VERY IMPORTANT NEW TESTAMENT SCRIPTURES ON THIS SUBJECT:

- 1 Thessalonians 5:11: Therefore encourage one another and build each other up, just as in fact you are doing.
- 1 Corinthians 15:33: Do not be misled: "Bad company corrupts good character."
- John 15:13: Greater love has no one than this: to lay down one's life for one's friends.



God's Important Messages about Friendship/Friendliness:

Some of God's encouragements concern choosing friends wisely, not betraying friends by gossiping or revealing secrets, and picking friends with whom you can both be truthful and supported. Children are more often interested in gaining friends than in being a good friend; though the opposite can be taught.

God's Important Messages about Hope:

Children can put a great deal of hope in God's help, God's future, God's rescues, etc., but they need to be taught. Once taught, it is great fun to watch them hope because their imaginations are much stronger than adults', and they have far less difficulty imagining things they are hoping for.





BIBLE STORIES SHOWING HOPE:

- In Genesis 6, Noah builds the ark out of hope for his family's future. Abraham built two altars based on a promise from God, in Genesis 12:8 and 13:4, because of the hope he had in God's word.
- David gave God his promise to build a temple. Though it was not completed in his lifetime, he had hope in his son Solomon. His prayer is in 2 Samuel 7.
- Some great Psalms of hope include Psalms 30, 31, 39 and 42.
 Pentecost is a great story of hope in the future and hope coming to fruition. Located in Acts 2, it tells of the disciples gaining the great understanding promised to them, but also looking into a future of uncertainty but with the promised hope of the Kingdom of Heaven.

BIBLE STORIES SHOWING LOVE:

- Luke 15 is a great resource for God's Love, containing both the Parable of the Lost Sheep (Luke 15:3-7), The Prodigal Son (Luke 15:11-32). The Parable of the Lost Coin, a lesser known parable about God's love, falls between the two (Luke 15:8-10).
- Of course the ultimate story of love is Jesus' death on the cross. However, the explanations provided are in other passages that aren't imbedded in the story. John 3 contains not only the "God so loved the world" famous verse (16) but many others that bring understanding about the depths of God's love.


God's Important Messages about Worry:

Children tend to worry more than adults realize. Because they don't often understand the boundaries of reality, they are often afraid of more things than they need be. Comforting words from Jesus and God can likewise be more healing to them than adults realize. Words of divine protection, comfort and security will not go back void.



BIBLE STORIES SHOWING WORRY:

- In Exodus 3 and 4, we see Moses giving God a list of reasons why he should not be the one to go to Pharaoh. He was worried that he wasn't a good public speaker, he was worried about his past. God knew that Moses would lead the Israelites out of captivity. All Moses had to do was believe and go.
- In Matthew 6, Jesus has exacting words about why we should cease to worry in verses 25-34.
- Deborah's instant and easy agreement to go into battle with her commander shows a great example of faith over fear in Judges 4. Deborah's whole story is the chapter and is grand.


We all need perseverance, because God allows everyone to go through periods of testing, waiting, and not knowing. It is a big part of building faith. When children come into tough periods, they should decide whether these could, in fact, be tests of either faith or endurance, through which they need to persevere.





BIBLE STORIES SHOWING PERSERVERANCE:

- 2 Corinthians 4 describes the challenges that Paul faced in his ministry and how he persevered. Paul is an
 excellent example of perseverance because he was stoned, imprisoned for his faith, and persecuted in
 many other ways.
- Joshua 10 & 11 show the great perseverance of Joshua's army. After being stalled out in the desert for 40 years, Israel had to go out in battle and earn their future land. Joshua defeated 31 kings or kingdoms according to these chapters.

Philippians 1:20: I eagerly expect and hope that I will in no way be ashamed, but will have sufficient **courage** so that now as always Christ will be exalted in my body, whether by life or by death.

THREE VERY IMPORTANT OLD TESTAMENT SCRIPTURES ON THIS SUBJECT:

- Joshua 1:7: Be strong and very courageous. Be careful to obey all the law my servant Moses gave you;
 do not turn from it to the right or to the left, that you may be successful wherever you go.
- **Deuteronomy 31:7:** Then Moses summoned Joshua and said to him in the presence of all Israel, "Be strong and courageous, for you must go with this people into the land that the Lord swore to their ancestors to give them, and you must divide it among them as their inheritance.
- 2 Samuel 7:27: Lord Almighty, God of Israel, you have revealed this to your servant, saying, 'I will build a house for you.' So your servant has found courage to pray this prayer to you.

THREE VERY IMPORTANT NEW TESTAMENT SCRIPTURES ON THIS SUBJECT:

- Mark 6:50: because they all saw him and were terrified. Immediately he spoke to them and said, "Take courage! It is I. Don't be afraid."
- Acts 4:13: When they saw the courage of Peter and John and realized that they were unschooled, ordinary men, they were astonished and they took note that these men had been with Jesus.
- 1 Corinthians 16:13: Be on your guard; stand firm in the faith; be courageous; be strong.



God's Important Messages about Courage:

We are very busy teaching children to be respectful and not bully or be aggressive. But we don't want messages of courage to be left behind. While we teach turning the other cheek, we must reassure that this and other peace gestures are not signs of weakness.





BIBLE STORIES SHOWING COURAGE:

- The end of Deuteronomy and the book of Joshua tell the story of Joshua taking over for Moses. Joshua is a good example of courage because God led him into many situations which seemed impossible, like bringing down the walls of Jericho, but Joshua had courage and fulfilled his mission to lead the Israelites into the Promised Land!
- In Judges 7, Gideon took on a huge army with only 300 men as a tremendous show of courage and faith.

God's Important Messages about Mercy:

Mercy and justice are seen as types of opposites in the Bible. The Old Testament focuses on justice (an eye for an eye); however, Jesus changed the world with his messages of mercy (forgive 70 times seven times). Children will often try to seek justice on their own. Hence messages of "revenge is mine, says the Lord" should be given often.





BIBLE STORIES SHOWING MERCY:

- 1 Samuel 24 tells the story of David sparing King Saul's life. Saul had been hunting David and trying to kill him for years. When David finally had the opportunity to kill Saul, he didn't.
- Joseph had profound mercy on his 10 brothers after they sold him into slavery. Years later
 when he recognized them, he gave them land and food and much of his kingdom. The story
 begins in Genesis 37 and threads through to the end of the book.

God's Important Messages about Anger:


Nearly all sins committed show some degree of emotions not being checked. A very important lesson for today is "faith first, facts second, and feelings third." With the reduction of faith in our society, feelings are rising to almost become facts. And yet they are much more likely to lead us astray than faith or facts.






BIBLE STORIES SHOWING ANGER:

- The classic example of anger gone awry is the Cain and Abel story found in Genesis 4.
- A second example is Moses murdering the Egyptian, for which he was banished to the desert for more than 40 years. (Exodus 2:11-14)
- Jonah 4 is a good example of the kind of anger Christians should avoid (as opposed to righteous anger). Jonah became angry with God because of his mercy toward the Ninevites. Jonah's anger did not produce good fruit and, as we all know, did not send him in the right direction.

- Ephesians 4:2: Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love.
- Romans 12:12: Be joyful in hope, patient in affliction, faithful in prayer.



God's Important Messages about Patience:

Waiting is part of living. God generally takes longer to bring his will to fruition than we mortals think it will take. It may have been 100 years between God's first conversations with Noah and the actual Flood. Moses waited until he was 80 to begin the Exodus. David had to run, hide, and live in caves for many years before becoming king. Even Jesus had to wait 30 years before showing any miraculous powers and wisdom.





BIBLE STORIES SHOWING PATIENCE:

- The book of Job is the perfect example for patience. It where we get the phrase "patience of Job" from! Job suffered many afflictions and refused to question God. In the end he was blessed with gifts beyond all that he lost, many times over!
- If patience were not critical, we would not be waiting 2,000 years for the return of the Messiah.

God's Important Messages about Self-Control/Discipline:


The need for self-control starts almost as soon as a child can communicate. Lessons in self-control will prevent younger children from snatching and hitting, and older children from spreading gossip, succumbing to peer pressure, and lying. Self-control is the forerunner of most choices.



BIBLE STORIES SHOWING SELF-CONTROL/DISCIPLINE:



- Luke 4:1-13 tells the story of Jesus in the wilderness. This is a good example if self-control because Jesus knew that God would meet his needs but still felt tempted by human desires. The fact that he stood up to the devil when the devil tried to tempt him stands as proof of his faith and self-control.
- Cain showed a lack of self-control in killing Abel in Genesis 4.
- Jonah showed a lack of self-control in disobeying God in Jonah 1-2.
