NOTE FOR PARENTS

As long as we are in a group or community of some sort, there will be moments of disagreement. That is a guarantee. You can take that fact to the bank and wait for interest! This is true in workplaces, classrooms, and locker rooms. It's true among spouses, band members, and commuters on the bus. Disagreement appears on political stages and in social media comment sections. **Anytime someone expresses an opinion, an opportunity presents itself to oppose and refute that opinion and dissolve into conflict.**

But what about the disagreements that happen in church? What about the divisions that take place, not over opinions or points of view, but over what we understand as Truth? Both Scripture and history offer examples of arguments among prominent church leaders, resulting in partings of ways and creations of new sects and branches of Christianity. How do we tell someone the truth that they are missing out on? There's a very simple answer; with love.

We must remember that we are all imperfect people living in a fallen world. But we were all created in the image of a perfect God, our Heavenly Father without blemish, Creator of all things who loves each of us more than we will ever be able to comprehend. Jesus died for us because of how deeply He loves us. And this is the heart posture God wants us to adopt in life, even and especially among those with whom we disagree. Jesus mentions that the measure we use for others will be used for us. Now, this passage from Matthew 7:2 talks about judgement, but I wonder if the concept is also applicable to love. Speaking the truth to others using fear, anger, manipulation, or shame as the primary motivation does not honor the value that God has placed on their lives. Nor would we feel loved or valued if someone used such tactics to reveal truth to us.

It is not enough that truth is simply spoken. God's truth, lovingly revealed to us, must be lovingly shared.

Memory Verse – Ephesians 4: 14-15

- 1. Why do you think disagreements happen?
- 2. How does God want you to treat people that you might disagree with?

Answer: God always wants us to treat others with love, respect, and dignity. Every person in the world is His child and created in His image. Even when we make mistakes or think/say/do/believe the wrong things, God's love for us does not change. Since God extends that type of love for us, and if we hope to receive love from others, we must extend that love even to people that we disagree with.

3. Can you remember a time when you disagreed with a close friend or a family member? What did you do to find common ground?
