SHEPHERDING LEADERSHIP

S DO NOT SEE MYSELF AS AN ACCOMPLISHED LEADER, but I have been called to lead Brooklyn Church for a time. My textbook for leadership over 30 years, apart from the Scriptures, has been <u>Spiritual Leadership</u> by J. Oswald Sanders. The elders and people who serve on the Deacon Board here are wonderful mature believers and it is a pleasure to lead them. I thought I'd share with you all some of my perspective on leading church leaders, a philosophy of leading.

A pastor must be a preacher of the Word, a shepherd of people, and a leader of the church that he is serving. Each of these assignments needs to be applied to the people who are leading with him. This becomes essential in seven areas as a pastor works with church leadership.

Christ Centered Humility

Jesus modeled leadership for us. He rebuked his disciples when they failed to understand.

But Jesus called them to Himself and said, "You know that the rulers of the Gentiles lord it over them, and their great men exercise authority over them. It is not this way among you, but whoever wishes to become great among you shall be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you shall be your slave; just as the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life a ransom for many." Matthew 20:25-28

Our Lord's example and instruction toward humility and serving others is the proper picture of leadership in the Kingdom of God. Jesus led His disciples into the truth and prayer by teaching and example. So, a pastor needs to teach and pray and serve. Galatians 5:22-23 lists for us the fruit of the Spirit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control. This is what church leadership needs from their pastor.

Direction

This means that the Pastor needs to know where he is going and where he wants to take people. Some people think of this as "vision." But, in the Bible, vision means a message from God that His people or prophet sees. Vision is always about what God is saying. A pastor needs to listen to the Lord. Then he needs to figure out where he is going and how to get there.

Thus the pastor needs to always be applying Biblical teaching to his goals and to the goals of the church he leads. This means devoting time to the Scriptures and prayer and doing this with others as well. Direction is not found in dreaming of success or a business plan but in prayer. It comes from God. This is different from the world's way, and the pastor needs to lead his people into experiencing God's direction and making good decisions.

Relationships

In order to feel loved, people need to *be* loved. This applies to leaders, pastors, everyone. Love is not a fuzzy feeling but commitment, time together, listening, giving, and caring. A pastor needs to love his people. He needs to be a student of the people he leads so that he knows how they are thinking and feeling. He needs to understand them. They need to understand him. This is not easy. Relationships must grow and trust needs to be built over time. The pastor needs to be a careful listener and he has to ask questions. All significant Christian maturity takes place in the context of relationships.

Administration

The pastor needs to be organized, manage his time, and give clear guidance to those who work with him. It is best if the tasks are well matched to the gifts and desires of the people working with him, but that is not always possible. Ultimately, leadership must work together as a team, helping one another. A certain level of organization is essential for both the pastor and those who are leading with him. They need to be able to make plans and carry out those plans and report on their progress. Regular meetings are essential, as is evaluation.

The Freedom to Fail

Things will not always go well. The pastor will fail and do things poorly. Other leaders will fail and disappoint as well. All is not lost. We actually learn more from our failures than our successes. The goal is growing closer to Jesus. We need to be able to say to one another, "That didn't go well." And, then there needs to be a sense of safety and personal acceptance. Our worth is not bound up in our performance. People are more important than programs. If we realize this, the programs will go better.

Development

The word "disciple" means "learner." It is essential that the pastor and other leaders in the church are always learning. This is what it means to be a disciple of Jesus Christ. We learn from Him, from experiences, from one another. We need each other to learn.

This means that all of us are works in progress, on the path that God has set before us. God puts you in my life so that I can learn and He has put me in your life so that you can learn. This means that the pastor needs to be thinking about how different people need to develop. He needs to be helping each person to learn the lessons that God has for them. Moreover, it is certain that their development will need more than the pastor's input. Thus, it is important that the pastor be helping them to find books, training, other people, conferences that will fit their needs and be a help to them as they learn to follow Jesus.

Managing Conflict

People will not always agree. When there is disagreement, consensus needs to be built as much as is possible. People need to see that love and cooperation is more important than winning. Jesus said, "They will know you are My disciples by your love for one another." (John 13:35) We love others, in part, by listening to them and not attacking them or their motives even when we disagree.

Leaders need to be instructed in how to handle conflict before it comes so that when it comes they are able to handle it in mature ways. When a pastor and the other leaders put a premium on forgiveness and peacemaking, it is then that a church can come together, even with differing perspectives, for the purpose of agreeing together to glorify God.

Now I exhort you, brethren, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that you all agree and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be made complete in the same mind and in the same judgment. 1 Corinthians 1:10
