Study this Book of Instruction continually. Meditate on it day and night so you will be sure to obey everything written in it. Only then will you prosper and succeed in all you do.

The Opposite of Failure

• What is the opposite of failure? It is not success; it is obedience—being careful to obey all that God has commanded. It is careful and conscientious obedience and not "assumed" obedience. "Assumed" is the opposite of deliberate and intentional. It is fictitious; it looks like something real but, in reality, it is a hollow representation with no actual substance. Their work

- We readily affirm love for God and obedience to His commands but diminish their absolute nature and their applicability to our own lives as though certain aspects of faith, obedience, and commitment are intended for other people, but not us. A true disciple of Jesus, however, is measured by his obedience to all that Jesus has commanded.

The Mirage of Success

 Anyone can be successful—especially in America! Hard work opens doors of opportunity and advancement.

Do you see someone skilled in their work?

They will serve before kings;

they will not serve before officials of low rank. (PROVERBS 22.29)

 Many of us are successful, but not because we have put God first; we are successful because we are serving the world system in the manner that it rewards.

 For example, the world system rewards the time you invest in study and sports by conferring good grades and scholarships. In the eyes of many-parents, teachers, coaches- this will make you a success. Will God look at those achievements and call you successful? Does He say that your first priority is to study hard and do well on your SAT? Will He affirm you for your good grades and call you a success— even if you do not make His word and obedience the priority of your life?

The 24/7 Priority

- Our busy lives and pressing priorities seem to have determined that God's revealed priorities are obsolete—that we can only compete in this world on its terms, not according to God's priorities.
- That is a lie— a satanic lie. Christ himself faced this lie in his temptation by the devil. His response emphasized the truth that we are no better, no stronger, no more successful than we are in loving and obeying the Word of God.

• Love is revealed by commitment; commitment is evidenced by priority; priority is proven by the investment of time and effort. How do you and I measure up to God's 24/7 priority?

And you must love the Lord your God with all your heart, all your soul, and all your strength. And you must commit yourselves wholeheartedly to these commands that I am giving you today. Repeat them again and again to your children. Talk about them when you are at home and when you are on the road, when you are going to bed and when you are getting up. Tie them to your hands and wear them on your forehead as reminders. Write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates.

God's Measure of Success

 Success by any other measurement, no matter how important or necessary it may seem, is, in the verdict of God, failure.

"In the future your children will ask you, 'What is the meaning of these laws, decrees, and regulations that the LORD our God has commanded us to obey?'
