## **Personal Reflection**

- 1. Describe how our worldview is like 6 strings on a guitar. Why is the "God string" so vital to all the rest?
- 2. Is there an area that was addressed on Sunday that particularly spoke to your season of life? Which one was it and why?

## **Group Discussion**

- 3. What recent disappointments are you carrying? How can you choose to see your current setback as an opportunity for God to work good this week? James 1:2-3
- 4. Does God work in disasters? How can you practice trusting God's unseen hand when your imagination can't picture how He's working? Gen. 50:20
- 5. How has God used even your past sins and failures to teach you, grow you, or make His grace more real? What is one area where you need to repent and allow God to bring good even out of your failure this week? Rom. 5:20
- 6. Is God present when you are hurt by others? What would it look like for you to forgive or release bitterness this week, trusting God to work even through the evil intentions of others? Rom. 12:14
- 7. Where might you have overlooked God's hand in the "details" of your life? What is one ordinary moment this week you can intentionally treat as a providential moment from God (e.g., a conversation, a chance meeting, an unexpected delay)? Psalm 37:23
- 8. Can you recall a time when you failed to do the right thing, yet God still worked in spite of you? Where do you need to step out in faith this week instead of holding back? What is one small act of obedience you can commit to? Eph. 2:10
- 9. Now as a group, **pray** for one another...that we'd live like Romans 8:28 is true this week. Pray that we'd look for and trust God with the days and moments of our lives.
