- 5. The rod symbolizes protection and discipline, while the staff symbolizes guidance and rescue. How have you experienced both sides of God's care His strength and His tenderness?
- 6. How does understanding God as both a protector and rescuer build your confidence to face life's challenges?
- 7. What are some practical ways you can remind yourself (or someone else) of God's presence and protection when fear tries to take over?
- 8. The verse says, "I will fear no evil." What helps you choose faith over fear when walking through your own valleys?
