Central Truth

Jesus came so we can know what God is truly like

1. Jesus reveals that God is eternal and 3 in 1.

John 1:1 In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. 2 He was in the beginning with God.

Ephesians 1:9-10

2. Jesus reveals that God is not distant or hidden.

John 1:14 And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, 18 No one has ever seen God; the only God, who is at the Father's side, he has made him known.

Questions for the Community

Personal Reflection

- 1. What's a misconception you once held about God that has changed over time? What helped correct it?
- 2. When you think about Jesus' arrival at Christmas, what feelings or memories surface—curiosity, confusion, nostalgia, awe? What do you want for THIS season?

Group Discussion

- 3. Read John 1:1–3. What stands out to you about Jesus being present "in the beginning"? How does this inform the way you think about Him?
- 4. In verse 14, John says the Word "became flesh and dwelt among us." What does that communicate about God's posture toward humanity?
- 5. What does it mean to "receive" Jesus and "believe in His name"? (vv. 12–13) How does this help us truly know God?
- 6. Looking back over the "10 Misconceptions" from Sunday:
- Which have you personally wrestled with?
- Which of Jesus' corrections was the most surprising or comforting to you? Why?
- Why do you think humans so easily project their assumptions or fears onto God?
- If someone asked you, "What is God really like?" how would you answer based on what Jesus reveals?

- 7. Use these as prompts for a closing time of prayer:
- · Thank God for revealing Himself through Jesus
- · Confess any false views of God that have shaped your thinking
- · Ask for eyes to see the Father clearly in Christ
- Pray that your group becomes a community that reflects Jesus' character to others
