Personal Reflection

1. How has darkness harmed you? What strategies have you used to push back the darkness?
2. Pay special attention to the world around you this week. How do the truths of light and dark continue to preach all around you?
3. How has the light exposed lies in your life? How do the lyrics "till he appeared and the soul felt it's worth" sit with you this Advent season?

Group Discussion

4. Read our text from Sunday. What stands out? What is Jesus claiming? Why the big Pharisee Freak Out?
5. Which of the 4 ways Jesus brings light to the world (as discussed on Sunday) stood out to you most in this season?
6. How do you feel about the statement "You have no secrets. You've already been found out." (Comforting? Terrifying? Mixed?)
7. Read Matthew 5:14–16. If we ARE light in Christ, what does that mean for how we live?
8. How does light shine through "broken and mixed up people"? Share an example from: Scripture; Your life; Someone you know

9. Follow through on one of the action items from this week or some other way Jesus is leading you on in the light.
10. Spend time as a group praying that the light of Jesus would (reveal truth-expose lies-comfort fears-guide decisions-shine through our brokenness)
