1. In the sermon, we discussed how the reason for an action changes our willingness to do it. Why is it important to move beyond "Easter tradition" and focus on the theological "Why" behind the holiday? 1 Peter 3:15
2. The sermon described the "Grand Canyon" gap between our sin and God's holiness. Why must we understand the "bleakness" of our condition before we can truly appreciate the "Good News" of a Savior? Romans 3:23; Isaiah 59:2
3. We learned that Jesus suffered "outside the camp," fulfilling the Old Testament picture of the scapegoat. What does it mean to you personally that Jesus became the "outcast" so that you could be brought back in? Hebrews 13:12-13
4. Paul says if Christ wasn't raised, our faith is "futile." Of the "proofs" mentioned (women as witnesses, the tomb and events being Jerusalem, the disciples' sacrifice, skeptics converted), which one strengthens your confidence the most? Is there a different proof that helps you? 1 Corinthians 15:14-17
5. The sermon described Heaven not as a "cloud" but as a New Earth where we have meaningful work without the "toil." How does this change your perspective on eternity and your purpose? Revelation 22:3
6. Whether you feel like a "Seeker," a "Prodigal," or a "Believer," the resurrection changes everything. What is one practical way the reality of the empty tomb will change your "Monday morning" this week? Romans 10:9-10
