The In-Between Time Pastor's Corner – Pastor Lisa Giacomazza

Holy Saturday, the day that sits between Good Friday and Easter Sunday, is a day of mourning and grief and yet preparing and knowing that what is next is glorious. So much of our lives is lived in just such a space. In Richard Rohr's book, Wondrous Encounters, Scriptures for Lent, he says, "the crucial in-between time — when everything actually happens and yet nothing appears to be happening. It is the waiting period when the cake bakes, the movement is made, the transformation takes place. ...he urges..."One cannot just jump from Friday to Sunday in this case, there must be a Saturday!"

For our church, in many ways we are in such a time – a time of transforming from what once was into what it will become. Like the cake in the oven, I wonder, have we stirred the bowl enough? Have we added enough ingredients? Have we followed the recipe as we should? And just what will the cake be – how will we know when it's done?

In many ways, the tomb was such a place. (Rohr shares...) "They laid the body in a tomb that had been cut into the rock, and rolled a stone across the entrance," says Mark's Gospel. Luke has the women "watch" and then they go home to prepare spices and perfumes, and "observe the Sabbath as a day of rest." Greatness does not just happen unprepared. It must be waited for, needed, desired and an inner space must be created. The Sabbath rest is everything – and yet nothing."

As we walked through our holy journey, the stone was rolled away and once more, when the women looked to see what they expected to see, what they came to prepare, it was no longer there. The preparation was done, and the result was prepared and was so much more glorious then they would have hoped for or imagined. Jesus walked among them, alive, defeating the death that had been put upon him by hate and judgement...and we, we follow. As we witness change in our lives, in our bodies, in our church and in our community, some of it so unsure, so unclear...yet, it is our time to walk it. We finally have to walk it ourselves.

Rohr tells us, "Remember, hope is not some vague belief that "all will work out well" but biblical hope is the certainty that things finally have a victorious meaning no matter how they turn out. We learned that from Jesus, which gives us now the courage to live our lives forward from here. Maybe that is the full purpose of Lent."


BARRY BABY IS COMING!
