Pastor's Corner Lisa Giacomazza, CRE Our Fears Limit Us....

From his book, <u>Centering Prayer</u>, <u>Sitting Quietly in God's Presence Can Change Your Life</u>, Brian Russell says this about fear:

"Let's face it. We are all afraid of something. Most of us are afraid of many things. Psychology teaches us that fear drives us. We fear death. We fear being alone. We fear being bad parents. We fear not having enough money. We fear being found out. We fear letting others down. We fear that we are not enough. These fears limit us and shackle us from becoming the people God created us to be. In fact, our fears are a form of idolatry. That which we fear becomes a god to us."

It is easy to become absorbed in fear. There are many things we cannot control and times when we feel alone in our worries. Yet, when we open the Bible and read scripture, it centers us in a way little else can. It is truth, it is filled with hope and direction that can pull us out of our fearful thoughts. Russell continues, "The Bible is a powerful book precisely in its ability to describe the human heart and condition. It reflects on our ambitions and dreams. It recognizes our potential for both greatness and failure. It does not sugarcoat life...it calls out our self-centered ambitions. It challenges us to realign ourselves with the ethic and purposes of God's kingdom."

To me, this is precisely why we come together as a people to reflect upon the words of God each week and share our thoughts with God and each other. It is a chance to adjust our thinking and come back to the love and light of Jesus.

What's on your heart today? What's weighing on your spirit?

Whether you're facing a challenge, walking through uncertainty, or simply feeling the heaviness of the unknown, take heart: God is already there. He meets us in every moment with something new—something unexpected and beautiful that our limited minds could never fully anticipate. Never underestimate the power of God's love for you. Never diminish your worth in His eyes. You are precious in His sight. And so are your loved ones. Let that truth settle deep in your soul today.

Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding but in all your ways acknowledge him and he will direct your path. – Proverbs 3: 5-6




Dog Days of Summer – Worship Sunday, August 10th Pet Blessings
