Bible Exploration

All Scripture is

God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting, and training in righteousness. (2 Timothy 3:16)

Many Christians around the world who follow the church calendar observe the forty days of Lent. It is a time of reflection and introspection that leads to Easter. As a church we engaged in the 40 Days of Love series. Many of us joined small groups, read the book, watched the videos, and used our workbooks. The weekly themes and teaching were highlighted in the Sunday sermons. If we are going to grow as Christians, we have to continue to engage our hearts and minds in the Biblical teachings of Christ and church wide studies are a great way to do this!

On March 31st we celebrated Easter, but did you know that there are six Sundays of Easter? On these Sundays we study and explore what Jesus did after he rose from the grave. The seventh Sunday following Easter marks the Ascension of Jesus, as he leaves earth and returns to heaven. The eighth Sunday following Easter is Pentecost Sunday; the day commemorating the New Testament's account of the Holy Spirit's anointing upon the Apostles of Jesus. There are 50 days between Easter and Pentecost. Our April and May additions of the Navigator I will include readings and questions that will place us on the journey Jesus took from his earthly cross to his heavenly throne. They will also include reading surrounding the powerful gift of the Holy Spirit and how that gift remains with us today.

First Reading: John 20:1-18

- 1. Put yourself in the shoes of Mary Magdalene, how would you be feeling two days after the crucifixion?
- 2. What has been the hardest "good-bye" in your life?
- 3. When a loved one dies, does the resurrection of Jesus bring you comfort?
- 4. At the sight of the empty tomb, do you think you have responded more like Mary or the disciples?
- 5. How has Jesus spoken to you in your grief? How does your faith give you strength?

Second Reading: John 20: 19-30

- 1. What are some reasons for locking doors?
- 2. Why might the disciples be afraid at this point in time?
- 3. How does Jesus approach the doubt of Thomas?
- 4. How does Thomas' reaction differ from Mary's?
- 5. What doubts or questions do you struggle with?

Third Reading John 20:1-25

- 1. What has happened in your life that could be described as a miracle?
- 2. What is the sweetest reunion you've ever experienced with family or friends?
- 3. Where do you go to think or pray? Does Jesus meet you there?
- 4. Why do you think Jesus asks Peter the same question multiple times?
- 5. What might Jesus be asking of you? Are you willing to do what he asks?

Fourth Reading Acts 1:1-11

- 1. Have you ever received a long-awaited answer to prayer? Was it worth the wait?
- 2. How would you categorize Jesus' ascension into heaven; sad, hopeful, or amazing?
- 3. Seeing Jesus ascend into heaven would you have felt worried, confused, excited, or abandoned?
- 4. Who is the gospel intended to reach? (v.8) What provisions has Jesus made? (v.8)

5. Where is God calling you to spread the Good News of Jesus?

Fifth Reading Acts 2:1-13

- 1. Have you ever been surrounded by people who speak a different language than you?
- 2. Was there someone there who was able to translate for you?
- 3. There is a huge feast going on in Jerusalem, Jewish pilgrims have traveled from far and wide to be there. Why is this an important part of the story?
- 4. Why do you think some people can hear their own language being spoken, and others hear nothing but strange noise?
- 5. Do you think you would be among those who were amazed and left in awe, or would you have stepped back is suspicion? (v.12-13)
- 6. Have you ever felt empowered by God to share your faith?

We raised \$2786.64


