
Wednesday Message: “THE KINGDOM OF GO!”

DAILY DEVOTION & DISCUSSION QUESTIONS:

Devotion for Thursday, September 17, 2020

Reading: Matthew 28:16-20 (ESV)

16 Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them. **17** And when they saw him they worshiped him, but some doubted. **18** And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. **19** Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, **20** teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. 1. What do you think the 11 disciples were feeling when they saw Jesus again?
2. Verse 17 says that "some doubted." Can you recall a time in your life where you were doubting? What do these seasons teach you about God?
3. What does verse 18 mean to you? How can we live in the power and authority of Jesus today?

Devotion for Friday, September 18, 2020

Reading: Matthew 28:16-20 (ESV)

19 Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, **20** teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age." - **Matthew 28:16-20 (ESV)**

1. What does the word disciple mean to you? (research a definition of discipleship)
2. Where in your life do you feel God is calling you to? What is the next step in your spiritual formation?
3. Ready the last sense of verse 20. What does this promise mean to you?

Devotion for Saturday, September 19, 2020

Reading: Ephesians 2:19 (ESV)

So then you are no longer strangers and aliens, but you are fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God. – **Ephesians 2:19 (ESV)**

1. What does this Scripture mean to you? How can you relate it to your own stories?
2. We also grow in our relationships with God when we're connected to others. How has your life group helped you grow?
3. If you're not in a Life Group, which people in your life on a regular basis can help you grow? Why is it important for us to have people in our lives?
