“THE KINGDOM OF GO!”

“May your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as it is in heaven.” - **Matthew 6:10 (CJB)**

Blessed are the peacemakers for they shall be called sons of God, blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. - **Matthew 5:9-10 (ESV)**

16 Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them. **17** And when they saw him they worshiped him, but some doubted. **18** And Jesus came and said to them, “All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. **19** Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, **20** teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age.” - **Matthew 28:16-20 (ESV)**

The word ‘GO’ appears 1,487 times in Scripture

Then the seventh angel sounded: And there were loud voices in heaven, saying, “The kingdoms of this world have become *the kingdoms* of our Lord and of His Christ, and He shall reign forever and ever!” - **Revelation 11:15 (NKJV)**

1. KNOW YOUR POWER
